
Another group of volunteers is comprised of those who work with the vet records. Three people enter the records of the pets into our database, and these describe the pets as you see them in Adopt-a-Pet or Petfinder, as well as any upcoming vet action, such as booster shot or other vet visit. Thanks to Nancy Jones, who enters all of the kitten records, Betsy Bailey who enters all of the adult cat records, and Shelley Shepherd who enters all of the dog records. Another record-keeping task is auditing the vet records to be sure AWL pays what we should. Betsy Bailey audits the vet records for all of the cats and kittens, and Annie Webster audits those for all of the dogs. The long hours these folks give to AWL help maintain our accurate records and ultimately help us apply for and receive grants and other recognition.

In the Spotlight for Adoption

Kittens galore!!! AWL has 34 kittens in foster care, nearly all are young kittens. A few are too young for





adoption, but most are ready for a new home. Here are two examples of our wide variety of colors, and personalities: **Sydney** & **Amber**. Call to make an appointment to visit them.

Sweet **River** is an Australian Shepherd who was a stray in the middle of a busy road, possibly waiting for his people to come



get him. He clearly lived with a family, is housetrained, gets along with dogs, cats, children, and even likes his crate. He's about 6 years old and is looking for a loving home.

Ryan Lund Memorial

Donna Lund (Ryan's mother and former s/n volunteer) said she wanted all donations in Ryan's name to go to the AWL and be used to "make a big impact." She knew of a feral cat situation at a Hot Springs store where employees were taking care of the cats. So, Angela Nickols arranged for the kittens to be taken to Kelly Vet for s/n and other health issues they might need. A pregnant cat will also be sterilized after the kittens are born.

AWL also knew of a woman in Greenwood, AR, desperately needing help with a semi-feral group of kittens. While we could not help with sheltering or adoptions, we could help with spay/neuter. A reduced cost vet in Fort Smith agreed to sterilize the entire colony & give rabies vaccines. 22 kittens were sterilized, treated for worms and fleas & ticks, and given their rabies shots. Total cost was \$1,842.00. These are beautiful kittens and will now have a better chance for adoption. This was such a wonderful and generous act on Donna's part in memory of Ryan. This has truly made a big impact!

Happy Tails

An adopter wrote: "I wanted to reach out to you and let you know our babies (who are basically all grown up) are still doing great. **Moxie** (a.k.a Ken) got so big! He's like a little tiger! And **Millie** (previously Ava), the or-

ange tabby, has gotten so pretty! They're really tuned into my kids and I just wanted to let you know how things are going.



"Millie is still the more playful, 'cat like' one. Moxie is more like a 'puppy cat' if that makes sense, he follows us around and is just a very good boy. I'm I hope everything is going smoothly with the rescuing. Moxie still likes to get up on my shoulders like he did to me the day I adopted them. It's adorable.

Tiny little **Danny** is a "teacup" Chihuahua, under 3 lbs., who lost his home. He is a senior, has a loving disposition, and needed a loving lap. He

found that! Now he can live his last years being well-loved and pampered! A foster made this possible!



Grants

A \$20,000 grant was received from an anonymous donor, for which AWL is so appreciative. The BOD has discussed how it will use the funds and will announce later after final plans have been made.

As in the past few years, AWL has helped adopters submit stories and photos to the Petco Love Foundation for a possibility to receive a grant. We have received some, so it's a great opportunity for the adopter and AWL.

The grant committee has also submitted an application for an additional Petco grant. Keeping fingers crossed!

Why Register My Dog with the POA?

All dogs physically housed or boarded for more than 30 days in Hot Springs Village are required to be registered with the HSVPOA. The registration fees go to the Animal Control budget which funds the shelter for the POA responsibilities, such as Animal Control Officers' pay, utilities, etc. These funds are not used for the care that AWL provides, such as all veterinary care, food, and litter. AWL continues to finance those parts of what is POA responsibility in accordance with our agreement to use part of the building for adoptions and housing.

Champions

AWL's program for a sustaining pledge is the "Champions." These committed folks contribute a small \$10 a month as sustaining members. Each month we have a 50/50 raffle, with a cap payout of \$500. **Champions AWL proceeds to date are \$42,810.00.**
