AWL Volunteers are Special

As an all-volunteer organization, AWL could not save hundreds of homeless pets a year without our numerous, hard-working volunteers.

This month we spotlight our **Recyclers.** This group of volunteers helps AWL earn money through various recycling programs. Most of our members are familiar with the aluminum drink can recycling, but AWL also collects and recycles empty ink cartridges – bet you may not have known that.

Aluminum Drink Cans

The recycling of aluminum drink cans started in 2004 when Recycling Center was just past the Animal shelter. Sue Fisher organized this and is still the point person. We had 4 guys with trucks who once a week would empty the bin at shelter and take up the hill to the site. POA ran this and would weigh aluminum cans and send AWL a monthly check. AWL also had various golf courses, restaurants, and churches saving cans, so Sue called on a lot of our members to go to various sites for weekly pickups. Price varies as each month it is the going rate per pound.

Then the POA closed the center. We scrambled and now pay \$100 a month to have TRG (in Hot Springs)

switch out the big yellow dumpster on Minorca and then they pay AWL monthly.

AWL thanks all who helped us over the years, especially our village people who save and bring us their aluminum cans. Our shelter animals have benefitted. AWL still depends upon our truckers too who pick up the cans and who don't mind getting smelly and dirty but are strong in their love of rescuing our village animals.

Empty Inkjet Cartridges

Mike & Chris Frantz are the only volunteers involved in this recycling, but they'd love to have more to recycle. They collect "used inkjet printer cartridges" - no toner cartridges. Once thev have enough to fill a medium size shipping box they are packaged up and sent off to the recycling center. Many of the cartridges have value to them for which we receive the redemption value. The redemption center then sends a check directly to the Animal Welfare League. The cartridges which cannot be reused are disposed of in an environmentally responsible manner. The funds raised can vary widely from one year to the next. The profit for 2020 was over \$200.00, so AWL could really use more of your empty cartridges. You can simply drop them off at the Adoption Center. You will help with the environment and get funds for AWL to help our animals!

Saline County


Once again, AWL received a generous grant of **\$15,000** from Saline County to be used on spay/neuter of Saline County pets.

Why Register My Dog with the POA?

All dogs physically housed or boarded for more than 30 days in Hot Springs Village are required to be registered with the HSVPOA. The registration fees go to the Animal Control budget which funds the shelter for the POA responsibilities, such as Animal Control Officers' pay, utilities, etc. These funds do not lessen the funding that AWL provides, such as all veterinary care, food, and litter. AWL continues to finance those parts of what is POA responsibility in accordance with our agreement to use part of the building for adoptions and housing.

Champions

AWL's program for a sustaining pledge is the "Champions." These committed folks contribute a small \$10 a month as sustaining members. Each month we have a 50/50 raffle, with a cap payout of \$500. **Champions AWL proceeds to date are \$41,415.00.**
