The perfect recipe for a great time!





Many of the pets that come into our care can quickly be placed for adoption after all their vet checks and immunizations. Sadly, some animals need extra medical care and attention. Andy is one of those exceptions who currently is recovering from an injured paw. According to Dog Adoption Coordinator Shelley Shepherd, "Andy is a complete love bug who is happiest when he can just hang out with his human friends and get love and cuddles and take naps." We hope Andy will be back to normal soon and find his forever home!



Urgent Need for Temporary Kitten and Momma Cat Fosters

During this busy kitten season, the AWL is looking for temporary fosters to help our felines in two vital areas - post nursing momma cats, and bottle feeding newborn kittens.

The first need is during the period momma cats have stopped nursing to allow their milk to dry up, which is typically 10 to 14 days. Once the momma cats are done nursing their babies they need a quiet space without kitten cries.

Depending on the actual cat, they could either be crated or just have the run of a small room in the foster's home (away from other animals). Once the milk is dried up, they will return to AWL to be spayed and then put up for adoption. All supplies will be provided by AWL.

Although newborn kittens are reared by their mothers, there are some circumstances where this is not possible, and humans need to step in to give assistance. On occasion, AWL receives very young kittens (less than 4 weeks

old) without a momma cat or else the momma cat cannot produce enough milk for the kittens to thrive. AWL is looking for volunteers who would be willing to bottle feed these kittens until they are 4 weeks old which requires feeding them around the clock at 2-to-4-hour intervals. Once the kittens are able to drink formula and eat wet food on their own, they will move to the kitten foster home to be cared for until they can receive their shots, be fixed and then put up for adoption. All supplies will be provided by AWL.
