## Generator eliminates evacuation of shelter animals during power failures!

Frequent power outages were once a source of anxiety for our volunteers - not to mention stressful for our animals - as they had to be removed from the Adoption Shelter. Now, with the purchase of an air-cooled generator, evacuations due to power failures are a thing of the past. The generator covers the full Adoption Center and will keep the AWL purring like a kitten if there is a power loss! The purchase was made possible by a grant from AARF, the Arkansas Animal Rescue Foundation, and we are very thankful for their generous donation to us.

New Autoclave Unit for Spay/Neuter Clinics Designed to make sterilizing instruments as easy and automated as possible, a new autoclave unit was purchased to expedite the process, thanks to a grant from the Neva McCormick Foundation. A good HSV samaritan alerted his friend, AWL volunteer Julie Gerush, when he discovered a stray cat sporting a tupperwear lid around its neck. Julie contacted fellow volunteer Beth Barrows, who came to the rescue with some traps and advice from Jill Jones and Animal Control Officer Payge Farewell. Affectionately named Tupper, the cat initially eluded rescue, but in the process a different stray was captured - a friendly female Bobtail they named Tuxie who was taken to Animal Control. The next day Beth set another trap, and soon Tupper was caught. Payge quickly took him to the vet so they could remove his "collar." Both Tuxie and Tupper received clean bills of health, and when the POA intake process was complete, were transferred over to the Adoption Center.

\*\*Update\*\* - Tupper is being adopted by the good samaritan who originally found him. Sweet Tuxie, who had been left behind when her owners moved away, is still at the Adoption Center waiting for her forever indoor home!

#### Saline County

If you are a Saline County resident, please consider donating the \$5 amount listed on the form to the Animal Control Fund. The AWL receives money from the fund, in addition to the Saline County Humane Society and the City of Benton Animal Control.

Nancy Jones, one of our Cat Adoption Coordinators, shares a story about one of our spay/neuter clinics held in Paron, which is in Saline County.

"When the Paron spay/neuter clinic was advertised, AWL received a phone call from a young woman explaining that she had moved back to Arkansas recently and found around 30 cats at her mom's farm that needed to be sterilized. She was signed up for (and showed up for) 4 spaces at the Paron spay/neuter clinic and, with trapping assistance from an AWL volunteer using AWL traps, another 24 cats have been sterilized at Waggin' Wheel on the spay neuter voucher program. In addition, Jill has taken in 17 kittens from that location for the adoption program. Since all of the cats and kittens are from Saline County, the Saline County grant funds have been used for these cats. You will see from the summary schedule that Saline County is collecting much less in 2023 than they have in previous years. While collections in 2023 were around \$65,000, many of the past year collections were in excess of \$100,000."

#### **Garland County**

While AWL does not get any money directly from Garland County, it is probable that AWL would get even more stray animals if Garland County was not providing \$50 spay/neuter vouchers to their residents. It is important for Garland County residents to make the \$10 voluntary contribution as well.


