## Baby Boom! Puppies and Kittens Born at AWL

It's tough being a stray dog or cat. Staving off hunger, illness, and injuries are just a few obstacles they must constantly overcome. For a stray dog that is also 45 days pregnant, the challenges increase enormously. Fortunately, a HSV resident found the pregnant stray (a beagle we named Ella) and notified POA Animal Control. Ella was rescued and carefully monitored while preparing for her litter. Two weeks later, Ella gave birth to 6 pups!





Ella has been a very patient mom to her litter, born the end of June. Now, safe and sound at the AWL, Ella and her pups are all doing well.

"Adopting" - not just for People

Like Ella, Princess was another pregnant stray found in the village, and was fostered at Cheryl Schaefer's home. Princess was placed in the crate next to Holly's, who had recently given birth to three kittens of her own. After Princess gave birth, she fell ill and was unable to nurse her kittens, who were only a few days old. Cheryl noticed that Holly was instantly curious about the kittens, and placed one in her crate. Holly immediately began to feed and bath it, and soon was nursing not

only her three kittens, but Princess's four kittens as well,

proving that volunteers aren't the only ones who rescue and help the animals at the AWL!
