AWL's Facility Updates Continue


In the January 2022 Rescue Report, we showcased many of the safety and aesthetic improvements made at the Adoption Center for the welfare and well being of our animals. Six months later, many more improvements have been made, and more are slated. We were able to facilitate this work due to anonymous donors who specified how their gifts be utilized.





New sturdy and safety fencing was placed around the Adoption Center dog kennels, while potted plants and landscaping beautify the AWL Memorial Garden* and adjacent parking lot area. *The AWL Memorial Garden was created with proceeds from the Ryan Lund Memorial Fund. Ryan was a good friend of the AWL and an animal lover.

Rescue Report

Keeping pets safe during our hot Arkansas summers!

Summer is a great season for people and pets, but the heat can also be dangerous or even deadly for dogs and cats. Heatstroke can occur when an animal's temperature rises to a critical level, and they can suffer irreparable organ damage or even die. Fortunately, you can help keep pets safe in the summer heat by following these precautions:

- Keep pets indoors during the day. It may sound obvious, but it's hottest outside when the sun is up.
- If pets do spend time outside during the day, ensure that they have access to shade and cool water.
- Exercise dogs during the cooler morning or evening hours, not in the intense afternoon heat. (Dogs who are seniors, overweight, have thick fur, or a pushed-in nose are even more at risk.)
- Note the temperature of sidewalks, asphalt, sand, or even packed dirt, which can cause severe burns.
- Consult a veterinarian about whether your pet needs a pet-approved sunscreen on exposed areas.
- •Never leave your pet in a parked car when the outside temperature is above 70 degrees. (If they're inside a car, recycling hot air, panting gives no relief, and heatstroke can happen quickly.)









Dog walker coordinator Julie Keck advises that when the air temperature is 86F, the asphalt temperature is 135f! Julie posts signs at the shelter to keep all dog walkers informed about heat conditions. "If it's too hot for your bare feet, it's too hot for theirs."

Spay Neuter Clinic at Mountain Pine Volunteer Fire Station

At our recent spay neuter clinic at Mountain Pine Fire Station on May 16th & 17th, 67 animals were sterilized (39 cats and 28 dogs) and 35 cats and 26 dogs received their free Petco vaccines, thanks to the Ozark Mountain veterinary staff. Our total sterilizations to date is now 8,369! Spay Neuter Coordinator Angela Nickols reports that a pet owner also received much-needed Angel Fund* help for his injured dog. Says Angela, "we are very privileged to be able to provide this help to the residents and pets in our surrounding communities and they are all so grateful." The next clinic will be held at the Paron Community Center on September 12th and 13th. For an appt., call Dorothy at 501-226-5772. *Angel Fund provides financial aid for emergency vet care to certain pet owners who cannot afford the necessary care.
