

#### Message from the President - "Come Be Part of Our Team"

During the GGH festivities, President Sue Luse delivered a very poignant message about the state of our non-profit. When she announced that the AWL spent \$17k in vet bills alone the previous month, there was a collective gasp by the crowd, and the reaction only intensified as she continued: "We partner with the POA, but the annual expenses that the AWL pays for are over \$300k every year - whatever our animals need, we treat them and get them healthy. It doesn't matter if they have heartworm or need surgery, we pay for it so you can adopt healthy animals." Sue added that the Adoption Center is run entirely by volunteers, which we always desperately can use. "Our need for support and volunteers is continuous - even 3 hours a month will help! Come and be part of our team." Emcee Beverly Fitzpatrick stated that "your support is the glue that holds the AWL together. It takes a lot to do what we do, and grants are not as plentiful as in the past."

#### Spay/Neuter Clinic Helps Alleviate Backlog

In an effort to help reduce the enormous backlog of area animals waiting to be spayed and neutered, a special make up spay/neuter clinic was held at Waggin' Wheel Veterinary Clinic on Sunday, August 13th. A total of 55 pets were sterilized – 43 dogs and 12 cats. Eligible pet owners used their low cost vouchers, and the cost of the clinic was supplemented by the AWL. The animals also received their rabies shots and vaccines, if needed, and at no charge to the pet owners.

Drs. Chris & Rebecca Bilby, DVM's, performed the surgeries, assisted by their staff. The AWL team, spearheaded by Angela Nickols, had over 25 volunteers working in shifts. Set-up of all our supplies took place the afternoon before so the group would be ready at 6:30 am the following day!

#### Coping with a Crisis

We are grateful to Waggin' Wheel for conducting this special clinic. They, along with Kelly Veterinary Clinic, are keeping our spay/neuter program afloat while we actively seek a source for our mobile clinics. Compounding the situation is the fact that Arkansas currently ranks last in the nation for veterinarians per capita, which hinders the ability to obtain affordable vet care. However, help may soon be on the way. Recent Senate Bill 476 (Act706) expands access to care by establishing a scholarship program for vet students who commit to practice in rural communities.

#### Kitten Explosion Update - Forty Felines Need a Fur-ever Family!



In our last edition, we announced that we were caring for 93 felines! It was, and still is, an enormous undertaking that we couldn't accomplish without the time and talents of many dedicated volunteers. The great news is that over 50 of these felines have been adopted, but as we go to print, 40 of these adorable, healthy, and lovable kittens are looking for their new home. #### **HUG (Help Us Go) Team Needs Your Help!**

Any AWL volunteer will tell you how gratifying it is to see how happy the animals are once they are adopted. And that's what we do, we create happiness for the animals and the families that adopt them.

Simply put, the HUG team is all about helping our dogs find their new family, wherever that may be. Since some of our dogs get overlooked because of their size or energy level, we partner with rescues in other parts of the country where the demand for dogs is greater.

HUG is seeking volunteers to help with any of the following:

•Transport dogs to Waggin Wheel to get their health certificate exam, and return them to the adoption center.

The AWL van is available to use, and the dogs are crated for safe transport.

•Bath dogs who will be transported.

• Transport dogs (using the AWL van) to meet their ride in North Little Rock which takes them to the partner rescue. A team of two volunteers are paired up for this job, which usually occurs around 3:30 AM.

According to HUG coordinator Rose Johnson, "The HUG team fulfills a very important role as every dog that gets adopted makes room for another dog that we can save.
