Happy Holidays from your Animal Welfare League!

At this festive time of year, we thank all of you - our generous AWL members, Facebook friends and followers, HSV area neighbors, and our dedicated volunteers - for supporting our lifesaving work during our holiday appeal and on Giving Tuesday. It is through your generosity that we can continue our lifesaving work. Your gifts have helped us place over 300 homeless pets in loving homes so far this year. Due to your philanthropy, here are just a few of the many animals that have thrived under our care, while we continue to help more animals with urgent veterinary needs, food, medications and spaying and neutering.



Abandoned & starving, the AWL nursed these four kittens back to health for several months before they were ready for adoption.



Hugo came to us very emaciated, had many medical problems including heartworms & mange, and ended up in our care for 704 days before he was adopted.

Frost recently was found outdoors with a severe eye injury and infested with fleas and ticks. Since he is declawed on all four paws, he was unable to protect himself. The AWL provided veterinary care to remove his eye, and he is currently recuperating and getting care at our foster home.

All current members of the HSVAWL were invited to attend our annual meeting and BOD election on November 20th at the Village Church of Christ. The current board of directors presented a brief summary of the year's activities, including cat and dog adoptions, fundraising, shelter operations, and grants, but the main topic was the No Paws Left Behind capital campaign and shelter expansion. President Beverly Fitzpatrick discussed the history of the expansion, including working with several departments within the POA, generating seed money, and completing all the building plans with Renaissance Homes. She added that she is very proud of "the AWL team and that the expansion has been a very behemoth undertaking."

Exciting Expeditious Expansion!



A lot of progress has been made since last month's update. AWL President Beverly Fitzpatrick reports that plumbing, electrical, and HVAC ducting are all completed. Shingles are being applied, light tubes have been installed, bathroom fixtures, . accessories, and specialty sinks are in storage, and the designs for the cabinetmaker have been finalized. Weather permitting, the expansion could be completed by March, 2026.



61 Animals fixed at Fountain Lake Spay Neuter Clinic plus a fond farewell to S/N founding director Angela Nickols

At the spay neuter clinic held at the Fountain Lake Volunteer Fire Station on November 21st & 22nd, 61 animals were sterilized making the total animals fixed to date more than 10,400. This has been a remarkable achievement, thanks to the enormous efforts and vision of Angela Nickols, who founded the Spay Neuter Program in 2007. It was a milestone year for the AWL, as Angela set up a 10 member committee dedicated to setting up and running the clinics. In that first year, 3 clinics were held, and now 18 years later, the AWL holds 5 clinics per year at locations in neighboring communities. Additionally, low-cost vouchers with our partner veterinarian clinics help defray the S/N cost to pet owners.

These staggering S/N statistics are even more impressive when you consider the following:

 In 6 years, one unspayed female dog and her offspring can produce 67,000 puppies • In 7 years, one unspayed female cat and her babies can have a staggering 370,000 kittens*

Angela informed us earlier this year that she and her husband Tom would be moving to Florida early in December to be close to her daughter, but that she fortunately would still serve remotely as the coordinator of the S/N program.

"I am so proud of our S/N program and all we have accomplished. It is all because of YOU and all your hard work and commitment. We have sterilized and vaccinated over 10,400 cats and dogs in the past 18 years and are part of Bissell's 'Fix the Future' program. She is regularly assisted by volunteers Carol Monk (center) and Lisa Ake. Every week they transport not only the precious felines, but tables, crates, chairs, food, toys, litter, signage and of course adoption forms. On a recent Saturday morning they hung beautiful cards on Petco's Giving Tree. The cards, handmade by Susan Senogles and Lisa Ake, featured every dog and cat at our shelter with their own "wish list." The Giving Tree is prominently displayed at the store's entrance where customers can choose a card for an animal they want to purchase a gift for, and gift bags under the tree are already overflowing with generous gifts!







Jill says that Petco and their customers "are awesome and really support the AWL. Through the years they have also given us several large grants, and they provide the vaccines at our Spay/Neuter clinics." The AWL has been a regular presence at Petco since Nancy Jones started coming every week in 2009. Carol Hardin (pictured below with Jill) has been Petco's General Manager for 12 years, adds that "Miss Jill is a celebrity - everybody asks about the cuddle babies. Customers call Jill the answer lady with all their feline questions!"



On this particular Saturday, no adoptions were made, but 7 year old Audrey made a donation instead since she said they already have 3 cats and a dog!

We recently learned that Julie Maricle, long time Waggin' Wheel employee and a good friend of the AWL, lost her HSV home to a fire shortly after midnight on December 3rd. Fortunately, Julie was able to safely evacuate the burning home. Since then, we were informed by Fire Chief Simmons that Julie's dog JJ's life was saved when firemen used a resuscitator donated by the AWL to revive him.



The AWL hopes resuscitators never have to be used on our furry friends, but we are so thankful that our donation made a lifesaving difference for Julie's beloved JJ. We will continue to donate resuscitators in all sizes for cats and dogs to our first responders.
