- Idea sparked in the mid-1990's & paperwork began in 2001
- 100 % Volunteer
- Over 2,000 hrs. donated in 2012. Operate without paid staff.
- Operate without financial support from federal, state or local agencies. Budget average between \$8,000 & \$10,000 per year. Less than 49% is administrative & fundraising.
- Operate with Idaho Fish and Game & U.S. Fish and Wildlife Migratory Bird Department rehabilitation permits.
- Receive more than 100 phone calls annually.
- Goal is to construct the first Nature Center of the IPNW.




The Reality of Nature




Without all types of native predators, the prey species population would explode. Leading to mass destruction of native vegetation, erosion, water pollution...

- In 1905 to 1925 hunters killed thousands of Cougars, Wolves & Coyotes.
- This threatened the <u>Deer</u> population!
- How? Because unchecked the population grew from a stable 4,000 to over 100,000 in 20 years.
- The habitat could not support such a population.
- 60,000 starved to death in one year.

"think like a mountain" - A. Leopold

- Think like a mountain is the coin phrase of Aldo Leopold, interpreted meaning where the mountain is not bothered by the wolf consuming the deer because the wolf keeps the deer in check. Without him, the deer overrun the mountain and consume all vegetation therefore destroying the mountain.
- You cannot, however, be excessive in your care: particularly with wildlife. Antoine de Saint Exopeny so aptly pointed out "You remain forever responsible for what you have tamed." and in Idaho State that is against state regulations.
- AHWF was formed to fill the gap between IDFG species preservation and the reality of injured individual animals.
