What is a LFP:



A Little Free Pantry is a box placed outside in an accessible location where food and other essential items can be made available 24/7 for those in need.

- Once installed, LFPs often require little maintenance
- A new LFP is a great way to encourage members of the community to get involved to make a difference in a simple but impactful way



Frequently Asked Questions

How are LFPs sustained?

LFPs are primarily stocked and maintained by members of the community. Community engagement and involvement is what makes this project a success. Additionally, for each of our LFPs, there is a person of contact who takes a primary role in ensuring the continuous operation of the pantry.

If I provide the location for a LFP what is required?

We aim to place LFPs in areas of need that are also easily accessible. In hosting the location for an LFP the most important thing is making sure that it can be accessed so that people can have the opportunity to give or receive from the pantry. Hosting a LFP does not mean you are expected to keep the pantry stocked; when community involvement is high the pantry usually won't have a problem staying stocked!

What is the success rate of LFPs?

With little free pantries across the state, there has been an overwhelming response of appreciation and support from communities where LFPs are located. Those who are most involved in this project have agreed that our established LFPs often work like revolving doors, with items frequently leaving the pantries and members of the community supporting the pantry by donating items, which keep the pantries stocked.



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What is Little Free Pantry Louisiana?

The Little Free Pantry Louisiana initiative is the leading force in the state of Louisiana in implementing and connecting little free pantries across the state to fight against hunger insecurity. This initiative serves the purpose of launching new little free pantries in areas of need while connecting already existing pantries through our network to provide support and resources. What is a little free pantry?

Little free pantries are a smaller scale more accessible version of the larger food pantries that are housed in a physical building with business hours. The little free pantry is an easily accessible way for those in need to at any time have access to food and other simple necessities.

How to get involved with Little Free Pantry Louisiana to make a difference.

There are many ways to contribute to furthering this initiative and the efforts to see that no one in our state goes hungry. One of the most significant ways to contribute to this initiative is to give; whether it be through sponsorship of a little free pantry, contributing items to the little free pantry nearest to you, spreading the word about the initiative, or following and sharing the Little Free Pantry Louisiana posts on social media.

Can a business, individual, or organization sponsor a little free pantry?

Benefits of partnering with the Little Free Pantry Louisiana initiative.

What types of items should be donated to a little free pantry?

Nonperishable food items such as canned, boxed, and bagged food items. Hygiene products such as menstrual products, deodorant, toothpaste/toothbrush, and soap. Household items like sponges, laundry detergent, toilet paper, and paper towels. Any items as long as they are unopened, in date, and can serve as an item needed by others could make a great contribution to a little free pantry.

What is the purpose of a little free pantry as compared to a standard food pantry?

Most standard community food pantries are operated by employees and volunteers with set hours of operation and certain times that food is distributed. The mission of the little free pantry is to serve as a more accessible extension of brick and mortar food pantries. While the standard food pantry will have more supply and readily available resources the little food pantry serves as an easy way for those in need to have any time access to free food and other necessities.
