

Lions Clubs International

History: Melvin Jones, founder of Lions Clubs. was born on January 13, 1879 in Fort Thomas, Arizona. Later on, Jones made his home in Chicago, Illinois and in 1913 formed his own Insurance Agency.

He joined a business luncheon group which was devoted solely to promoting the financial interests of their membership. Jones then asked, "What if these members, who are successful because of their drive, intelligence and ambition, were to put their talents to work improving their communities?"

At his invitation, the delegates from his business group met in Chicago to lay the groundwork for such an organization, and on June 7, 1917, "The Association of Lions Clubs" was born in the United States. In 1920, the Association expanded into Canada and officially became "Lions Clubs International", and expanded worldwide.

In 1925, Helen Keller attended the Lions Clubs International Convention and challenged Lions to become "Knights of the Blind" in the crusade against darkness". The Lions accepted her challenge and the Lions work ever since has included vision programs aimed at preventable blindness.
