

EPFA HUMAN RIGHTS POLICY

European Powerchair Football Association recognises the human rights outlined in the International Bill of Human Rights, specifically the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the UEFA Human Rights Commitment (December 2021)

EPFA encourages all our members in the European zone to ensure that

- Every powerchair football participant is entitled to equality of opportunity in the pursuit of sport without distinction of any kind and free of discrimination, harassment and violence.
- Every powerchair football participant has the right to freedom of opinion and expression
- The rights of every child participant in powerchair football must be protected.
- Every powerchair football participant is entitled to have his or her name, image and performance protected. A player's name, image and performance may only be commercially utilised with his or her consent, voluntarily given.
- Every powerchair football participant has the right to a private life, privacy and protection in relation to the collection, storage and transfer of personal data.
- Every powerchair football participant must be able to access an effective remedy when his or her human rights are not respected and upheld.
