- Would we revisit? Maybe if in the area. It was clean and well kept. You could definitely hear the nearby trains. It was about 20 miles to White Sands National Park. I would comment that pulling a big rig through some of the sites including our site, the trees need trimming as it is very difficult to avoid their branches scraping against your RV. Nearby & narrower sites make it difficult to swing wider to make the turn to pull through.

Up & down steep dunes, winding through the gypsum sand. We were fortunate to have a sunny mid 60-degree day to hike. The summer heat would be tough to hike in.
