We paid \$600.00 for 2 weeks. There was no cost for stays listed on the website. We ended up staying 4 nights vs 14 nights. We knew there were no refunds, but we chose our dogs safety over costs (see below). It would have been a nice gesture from the owners, but we were not offered any refund. Although he did ask us not to leave a “bad” review. Below you will see an “honest” review which is our style. **\*\*\*UPDATE:** We got a call from the other owner 3 days later. She was out of town when we left and wanted to check-in with us. We told her our concerns (listed under pets & trails below). She refunded us \$300 and said they were going to start clearing the field and building a dog park.



Discounts/Clubs/Hosts: We were not charged an additional 4% for using a credit card. No other discounts were listed on their website.



Facilities: Propane, storage, Laundry, showers, bathroom. They do accept mail/package deliveries.



Amenities: There is a gathering area with picnic tables, patio, and a BBQ next to the office. During our stay this area was used to park 3 campground equipment vehicles.



Pets & Trails: We did not have a good experience with our dogs here. There is no fenced dog park, which we knew. The open field within the campground is filled with goat head plants & thorns. Look it up they are nasty. We learned the

hard way. The locals said they let their dogs run through a field (not campground property) that is surrounded by a barbed wire fence. Yeah, no thanks. The rules stated dogs must be always leashed, but that rule wasn't followed by all guests. We did try to leash walk Rubi & Indi around the campground roads but even that didn't help. Indi had a bloody paw from a goat head we pulled out and the bottom of our shoes were covered with them. We ended up using needle nose pliers to remove them as they are so sharp. We found a dog park about 2 miles away that we used.



**Sites & Types:** Full hook-ups available, can accommodate up to 72' size rig, all sites are pull-through. 16 – 50AMP sites, 10 – 30AMP sites & many dry sites. There is no campground map, but the website does have a very nice drone video.



Check in time is 12:30PM. Check out time is 11:00AM



Our Site # 12A – Very long, mostly level, rock/pebble base pull through with full hook-ups, 50AMP, and a picnic table. Very quiet. Beautiful sunsets & peaceful views out our back windows.



Our Stay: Tuesday November 12 – Tuesday November 26, 2024. We chose to leave Saturday November 16<sup>th</sup> knowing there was no refund. It was just too much to drive the dogs to a dog park 2-3 times per day.



Cell/Internet/WiFi/Starlink/etc: We used our Starlink. Not sure if they have WiFi/Internet/Cable



Would we revisit? Maybe if they put in a fenced dog park and cleaned up the field of goat heads.



Area Attractions we did:

- Dog park in town about 2 miles from Goldminers. It was next to a playground, park & community center. There were still a few goat heads but a sign on the fence door said to please check your shoes, remove goat heads, and place in trash can.

- Wilcox Wine Country includes a bunch of different wineries & vineyards. We saw signs for the winery near us (1764 Vineyards) but never got there due to our shortened stay.

We bought freshly homemade tortillas, tamales, salsa, and fermented garlic bread. All were very delicious. There were also local artists with jewelry, clothing, honey, jams/jellies, & a variety of canned or pickled vegetables.
