
\$ We paid \$ 50 per night.

Discounts/Clubs/Hosts: none. Website says Good Sam, but they don't honor that anymore.

Facilities: Shower rooms and bathrooms available but not clean. \$15 to pump your tanks- available on Mondays & Thursdays. They did pump ours on the Sunday before we left Monday morning, which was nice. Dump station not big rig friendly. Lodge has tables & chairs. No mailbox so only UPS or FedEx but not suggested to accept package delivery.

Amenities: Playground, fishing, boat launch, swim area (no lifeguard), horse shoe pit (overgrown), campground hosted activities while we were there included: clam chowder cook off, Mic Mac Mayham concert filled weekend, corn hole tournament. Carpets allowed. Firewood \$6 an arm full (unfortunately it burned poorly w/ very black smoke)

Pets & Trails: 2 pet limit per site but we saw as many as 7 per site. No trails, no dog park, dogs must be always leashed. There were pet poo bag posts available. No trails within the campground. We walked the roads but cars/golf carts drove by very fast.



• Check in time is 1PM/Check out time is 11AM. Website is out of date; we never got any check-in information packet about the campground or surrounding visitor's guide although we did arrive on Labor Day.

Our Site #12 pull through, spacious, tree needles everywhere (the picnic table cracks were stuffed with them), there was a low wire going through our site, dark due to tree coverage, sap got all over the RV & truck (owner did say we could wash it on Sunday)

Our Stay: 9/2 - 9/16, 2024 (recommendation from an old army buddy from basic training family/friend owned). Owner told us she prefers her seasonal campers vs come/stay/go like us. She was very friendly & talkative overall.

Cell/Internet/WiFi/Starlink/etc: We used Starlink. The campground had no WiFi. Not Verizon friendly.

Would we revisit? No. It didn't feel big rig friendly; it was very run down, roads were in terrible condition with large potholes & big ruts. Neighbors were friendly but most seasonal rigs/lots were not in good shape.
