RIDER

HAT must comply with the following standards:

- PAS 015:1998 or 2011 with BSI Kitemark
 - VG1 with BSI Kitemark
 - Snell E2001 with official Snell label and number
 - ASTM-F1163 2004a with SE1 mark
 - AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards

PAS 015:1998 or 2011 and Snell E2001 meet higher impact criteria and therefore give more protection.

A jockey skull cap must be worn for cross-country riding over fences 0.80cm high and above (including Eventing, Tetrathlon, Horse/Hunter Trials), Pony Racing and Mounted Games.

It is also strongly recommended that a jockey skull cap is worn for cross-country riding over lower fences.

Hat cover should be any dark colours - no bright colours

Hat must be checked and tagged by a branch official to confirm that it complies with the above requirements.

BOOTS jodhpur boots or leather or rubber riding boots in black or brown and with smooth soles.

HALF-CHAPS plain (no tassels or fringes) in colour to match jodhpur boots

JEWELLERY: wrist watch, tie clip & wedding ring may be worn. No other jewellery including body piercings.

HAIR: long hair to be plaited, in a tidy bun or hairnet. No long pony tails.

JODHPURS pale cream or beige

SHIRT white or pale blue SHIRT and tie or BHPC Polo shirt

JACKET with Pony Club badge and test felt on left lapel

or

PONY CLUB SWEATSHIRT or SOFTSHELL - NO HOODIES TO BE WORN

CROSS COUNTRY RALLIES/TRAININGS – As above but including:

A BODY PROTECTOR meeting BETA 2009 Level 3 standard (purple label) must be worn for cross-country riding.

Long sleeved pony club rugby shirt/ jumper/base layer. XC colours can be worn. NO HOODIES ALLOWED AT ANY TRAINING AND NO SHORT SLEEVES, Navy or black jodhpurs can be worn

EVENING TRAININGS: As above but:

Plain dark coloured jodphurs (no bright colours), long sleeved shirts/jumpers or skins, Polo/T shirts can be worn in the summer but shoulders must be covered. Hair tied back, no jewellery, NO HOODIES/coats with hoods when riding.

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<u>PONY</u>

Pony should be clean and tidy, it is not necessary to plait. Tack should be clean, sound and suitable for the type of activity you are doing. Numnahs should be white or any solid colour but may have contrasting binding. Please ensure tack is fitted correctly and stitching must be checked regularly (especially stirrup leathers)
