HOW DO YOU MAKE MUSIC

- Learn an instrument: You can train your ears and learn to play an instrument.
- Write music: Practice writing music and melodies.
- Set up a studio: You can set up a studio at home or rent a space.
- Use a DAW: A digital audio workstation (DAW) is a software program that allows you to create, record, arrange, mix, and master sounds. Some free DAWs include GarageBand and Movavi Video Suite.
- Record and mix: Record vocals and instruments, and then mix the tracks together.
- Master: Master the final mix to improve the sound quality. Music production is a complex field that can take months or years of study and practice to master. However, anyone with a working set of ears can learn music production, even if they don't understand music theory.

- Jazz origins: Jazz was created by adding influences like blues, ragtime, marches, and early pop music from the 1900s.
- Music and learning: Music can help develop language and reasoning skills, improve memory, and increase coordination.
- Singing benefits: Singing can improve breathing, posture, and social skills, and can boost the immune system. It can also be a form of therapy and a workout.
