

Triple P is used in more than 30 countries and has been shown to work across cultures, socio-economic groups, and in many different kinds of family structures.

Triple P: Positive Parenting Program

Do you have a child aged 14 or under? Have you had concerns about their behavior? Sign up for this intensive training in positive parenting! Join us online to learn a variety of parenting skills to apply to multiple contexts. For any parent who can commit to 6 weeks of group sessions and individual appointments: this course is for you!

Parents will learn 17 different strategies for improving their children's competencies and discouraging unwanted child behavior.

Roleplay, homework exercises, and discussions involving video examples of effective parenting strategies are used to help parents learn methods for dealing with unwanted child behavior and support for emotional needs.

Participants receive a free workbook and can earn a Triple P Parenting Certificate upon course completion.




