

NEXT DEMO - Coming up on Tuesday, May 9, 2023. The presenter of the demo is Nancy Tongue, who paints in oils. Her website, www.nancytongue.com, contains brightly colored seascapes, gardenscapes, landscapes, abstracts and still lifes, among kinds of art. Nancy has won awards for her work, shown here. She also sells/rents some of her work through the Portland Art Museum rent and sale program, and will share with us some of the things she has learned and the best way to approach them with your art.





In our June 13 meeting, we will have a colored pencil demonstration by Karl Rousett, who can make his colored pencil technique appear like a painting. Every time we see his work, we are very impressed by both the detail present and the brightness of colors.


