NCAG and Rotary Bingo Fundraiser




April Meeting and Upcoming Events

Berdell was the guest artist for the March demo. She shared her view on how to sign your art. Ask yourself "What feels right?' Put your signature in that spot. Use a Sharpie or technical pen to sign your art. She demonstrated the difference between acrylic paint, watercolor paint and alcohol ink.



She also talked about gelli art prints and what materials you needed. She demonstrated gelli printing and how to create different textures.
