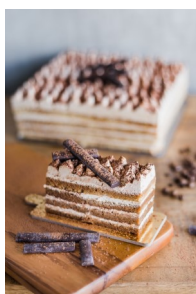
President's Message March 2024

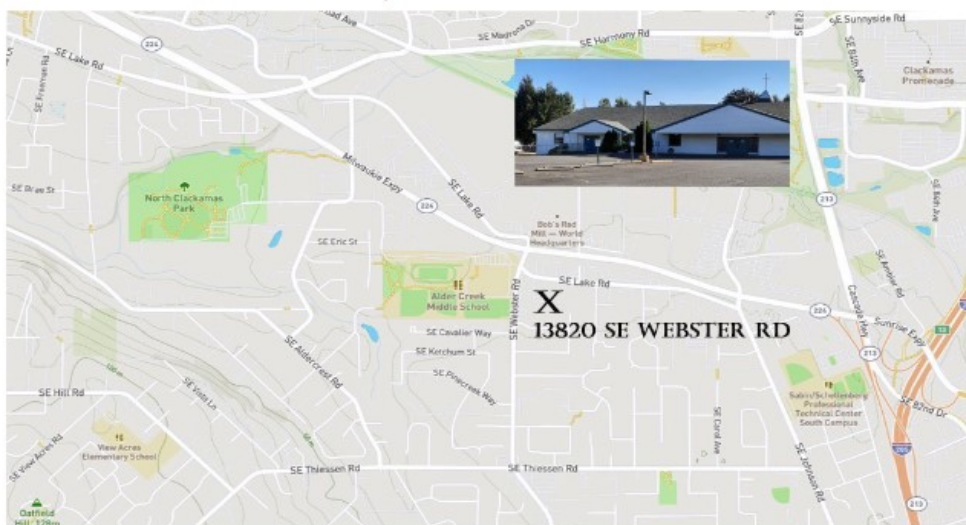

Regular meetings are held at the Saving Grace Church from 11am to 2pm, on the 2nd Tuesday of each month.

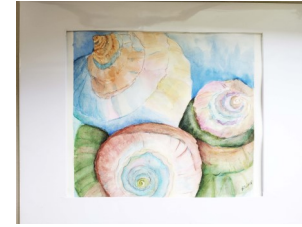

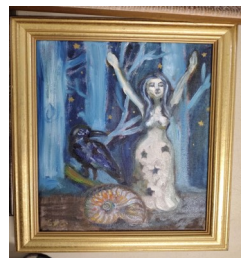

Use a Sharpie or technical pen to sign your art. She demonstrated the difference between acrylic paint, watercolor paint and alcohol ink.



She also talked about gelli art prints and what materials you needed. She demonstrated gelli printing and how to create different textures.
