While I do paint on a larger scale with acrylic, oil, and watercolor, working as a Framer at Michael's for the last few years has given me access to many media options on a daily basis. I really enjoy process, and my most recent favorite has been to use alcohol ink markers on a variety of fine art papers. I love the smooth blending they can produce, and the incredible array of colors that are easily, and somewhat affordably, available.
