October Demo

We were fortunate to have Portland-area-based artist Marla Baggetta as our featured guest at the October meeting. Marla has been doing art work since she was a child and has her degree from a prestigious art institute. She travels around the country and internationally teaching art. She also has online classes, including her most recent Drawing Inside and Out. Marla talked about her process and showed us her various sketchbooks. She likes to do a small thumbnail version first as this allows her to see any mistakes on a small scale. She feels drawing is essential to painting. Her demo was worked in pastels, and she showed us a small portion of her supplies. Her current preferred pastel is made by Blue Earth, but she uses different pastels as each brand has different characteristics and while some are hard others are soft. She sometimes works from a reference photo, but she said you should use it but not let it use you. Don't try to copy everything but also don't make up something that's not in the photo. She began her painting with charcoal and roughed out all the shapes which she said shows her the values right away. She moved the trees down in her painting so there was more sky and eliminated the road as she didn't feel it was important. She looked at her pre-sketch to determine placement and amount of sky versus land. Then she proceeded to add additional layers of color. She said she always errs on the side of value rather than color. She wants the finished painting to be fresh and not overworked. She will sometimes use Krylon Art Fixative as it is the best value for the money. It was quite amazing to watch her take her pre-sketch of black charcoal to her vibrant finished painting of light-dappled trees and a distant mountain. She left each of us her card and a small duck pin. By going to her website, we can sign up for her mini art lessons and a confirming email she sends includes links to a couple of downloadable PDFs.


