## March Demo



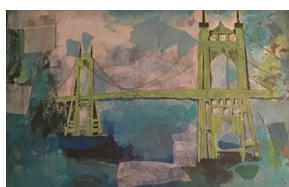
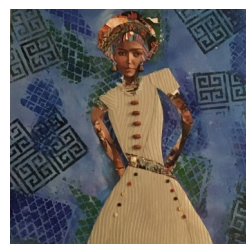

## President's Message February 2024

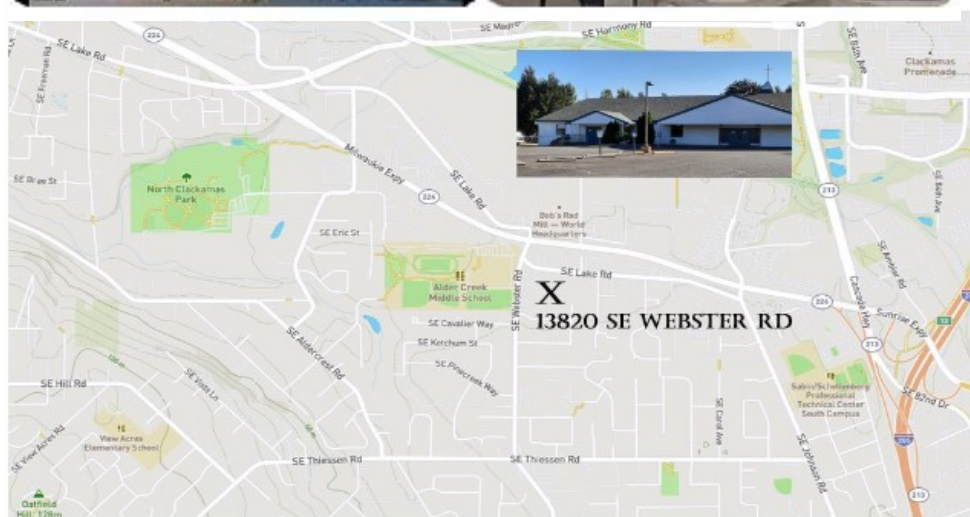

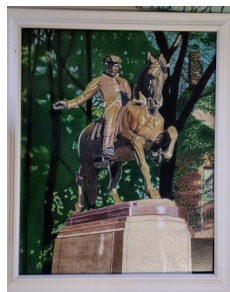

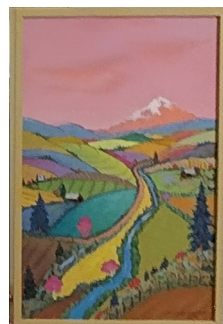
