

YOUR CREATIVE JOURNEY

At the beginning of a creative journey, most people have an inner critic that is always ready to point out the things that go wrong. The best way of silencing this voice is to trust the process. However, the very fact that you have chosen to create art means you are probably sensitive to aesthetics, and it is important for you to make something beautiful.

The "skill gap" is the difference between your skill and your ability to make something you like. It takes time and practice to close this gap and your first works will not be masterpieces. Many people quit during this stage because they doubt their ability to create something they like, and this is a big mistake. What you really need to do is to trust the process and keep practicing.

So here is a trick that keeps me inspired when nothing seems to go right: create something very simple that can't go wrong. You could just paint circles or vey basic shapes, simply allowing the watercolor to mingle on the paper and enjoying the results. You not only create something good to look at, but these simple experiences will help you experience the fun and joy of painting as you get closer to the execution of more complex shapes and ideas.
