During the January meeting, we discussed details about creating our own Artist's Bio and Artist's Statements. The first is mostly about you as an artist, and your why. Your sources of inspiration or path to "art," as well as what you hope others will sees in your paintings. Remember, this will be on the internet so be cautious of too much personal information, such as when you were born or where you live and so on. The artist's statement is focused on your artwork and what led you to your choice in media or style. Both statements should be typed, include a photo of you, one or more of your paintings, and not exceed 200 words. If you do not have access to typing or image manipulation, please

let Barbara Seliner or Betty Kellogg know, and we will see that yours gets typed, reviewed and prepared for the website.

This is a benefit of Guild membership, and can be used by you as a way to show your work "on demand" by referring guests to your page on the Guild website.


President's Message—January 2023


