Social Media Information


Being active on social media is a way for artists to reach out to those interested in art. We can share not only our art, but how and why we create art. Unfortunately, this often opens a doorway to scammers and hackers. How can you avoid having someone steal your art online? How do you recognize a legitimate message from Meta (Facebook and Instagram) and one that is a scam?

I will be sharing examples and information on what you can do or what to look for. Once you know where to start, you can dig deeper and decide how far you want to go with social media and what you can do for security.

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Social Media Information

On Facebook, scammers are usually after information like your password, which most people would never give out under normal circumstances. What if you get a message notification in your Inbox or an email that looks like this:



This is a copy of an actual message that was in my Facebook Inbox. I have also received a similar message through my professional email. Since artists want people to contact them, it becomes a little more challenging to protect your personal information.

How can you know this is a scam? Here are some tips:

- 1)Look at the opening remarks in the email. "Your Facebook page is scheduled to be permanently removed..." creates a sense of urgency or even panic. Be suspicious of messages that demand immediate action or are threatening your account with suspension.
- 2) Look at the link. Does it have misspelled words, unusual combinations of words or numbers? Tip: hover over the link with your mouse. If it leads to a different URL from the listed link, it's probably a scam.
- 3)Be wary of messages that have grammatical errors, overly formal phrasing, or just unusual sentence structures. Not all messages will fit this description. The example here looks legit until you look at the link.

There is more on how to recognize a fake message on Meta, what security steps to take and a way to check and see if your art images are being used on another site or even being sold without your permission.
