the technique. The black paper at right revealed the production of bamboo leaves as done in the Heron painting. There has been much discussion of her demo and we can expect to see usage of this technique in our future critiques.

The collage workshop formerly scheduled for that date has been postponed.


## President's Message—March 2023

An email will show up in your inbox with the link to the meeting Thursday after the in-person meeting. Click on the link in the email, close to the start of the meeting. Then wait till the meeting begins. It will ask "Join with audio or video" either one will do, Click that. It will automatically get you in the meeting and you can see and hear all who are in attendance. If you are confused, just ask one of your children, grandchildren, nephews or nieces, they do it all the time and you'll see how easy it is, so give it a try the next time you can't get to our in-person meeting, join us for our Evening Meeting. We'd love to see you and hear what you have been up to and stay in touch with the art world you love!
