

#### Not as old as we thought.

Recently, some work I did with Greg Herbert was published in the journal PLOS.ONE (see links) and promoted on National Geographics web server. Essentially, we found that my previous estimates that horse conchs (Triplofusus giganteus) could live 50 years or more was wrong. The work Dr. Herbert and his lab did confirm that horse conchs mature at an age of 6 or 8, and only live about 12-16 years. When I estimated the age of the largest conchs earlier, I didn't realize that male horse conch never grow as large as females, and most of the truly gigantic horse conch are probably female and females may only breed a few times in their life. Hopefully this will lead to more attention for our state shell and maybe better protections. Remember to always consider your actions if you decide you want to collect a live shell.

Richard W. Fearn, 87, passed away peacefully Friday, March 11, surrounded by his loving family. He was born in West Springfield, MA to the late Alexander and Frances Fearn and was raised in Agawam, MA where he has resided for most of his life. He was educated in Agawam High School and is a graduate of Trade School in Springfield where he majored in Automotive Mechanics. He enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1954, earned the rank of Master Sergeant, is a graduate of the NCO Academy in Knoxville, TN and remained active with the organization for many years. He served his country for 40 years, serving in Korea and Vietnam Conflict. Following his tour of duty in Phalsbourg, France, he returned to his home in Agawam, continued his service in the Air National Guard while working for the Town of Agawam where he was the Master Mechanic Firefighter for 30 years and established his automotive transmission repair shop in Agawam, which later relocated to West Springfield and operated for 30 years. Richard's love of NASCAR began as a teenager and was further fueled and became his lifetime passion as the firefighter who drove the firetruck at Riverside Park Speedway. He was a Master Mechanic crew member at both Riverside Park and Stafford Speedways and a member of New England Antique Racers. Following his retirement, he became a Florida resident for 20 years. He was a member of the Air Force Sergeant Association; American Legion in Safety Harbor, FL; Elks Lodge in Westfield; St. Petersburg Shell Club in St. Petersburg, FL; the Suncoast Conchologists Shell Club in Clearwater, FL and the Agawam United Methodist Church in Agawam where he served as a trustee for many years. Along with his parents waiting to greet him into his eternal life are his brothers, Robert Fearn and Alexander Fearn, Jr. He leaves his beloved wife of 64 years Betty Fearn; son Thomas Fearn and his wife Susan Fearn; daughter Diane FearnThomas and his brother William Fearn and his wife Judy. The funeral was held at the Agawam Curran-Jones Funeral Home Friday, March 18th followed by burial in the Massachusetts Veterans Memorial Cemetery.
