Suncoast Conchologists Emblem Shell

Suncoast Conchologists Strombus alatus, is commonly known as a Fighting Conch, or Florida Fighting Conch.

This conch, in the Family Strombidae, named by Gmelin in 1791, grows to an average of 3 inches. It is yellowish to brown, often with spots or zig-zag stripes. The aperture is long, the lip is thick and flaring, with a notch below. Juvenile alatus do not have this flared lip.

Fighting Conchs live in various sandy locations through-out Florida. They may also be found as far north as North Carolina and as far west as Texas. Your founding members decided upon this special shell in September, 1984, at one of our "planning" meetings.

Member Corner

CONCH CHOWDER

INGREDIENTS

2 cups conch

8 cups water

2 tbls shortening (Crisco or Bacon fat)

2 cups onions, chopped

2 cups celery, chopped

1 cup green pepper, chopped

1 cup carrot, chopped

1 garlic clove, minced

3 quarts water

4 potatoes, peeled and diced (= 4 cups)

1 (10 ounce) can tomato puree

1 (6 ounce) can tomato paste

3 tbls fresh oregano, minced (or 1 tbls dried)

3 tbls fresh basil, minced (or 1 tbls dried)

2 bay leaves

hot sauce

salt

pepper

DIRECTIONS

Pound conch with a mallet to tenderize then chop into small pieces (3/4 - 1 pound, may substitute large shelled clams)

In a large saucepan (soup pot) over high heat, bring conch and 8 cups water to a boil. Drain and set aside.

In a large skillet over medium high heat, melt shortening (or bacon fat). Stir in onion, celery, bell pepper, carrot and garlic and saute until browned. You may have to cook in batches depending on size of skillet. Transfer vegetable to soup pot when cooked.

Add drained conch and 3 quarts of water to soup pot along with potatoes, tomato puree, tomato paste, oregano, basil, bay leaves and hot pepper sauce.

Put soup pot over high heat and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 1 1/2 hours or until conch are tender and potatoes are cooked. Discard bay leaves. Add salt and pepper to taste.

Scallop Casserole

This recipe came from our first edition of *Shorelines*, Nov.-Dec. 1984

1 clove garlic, cut in quarters 1/4 cup butter 1/2 cup minced onion 2 1/2 pounds scallops 1/4 cup dry white wine 2 tbsp. flour 1 cup half and half 1/2 tsp. salt

Topping

1/8 tsp. white pepper

1/2 cup cracker crumbs 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese 1/4 cup unsalted butter Parsley flakes

Heat oven to 400 degrees.

Sauté garlic in ¼ cup butter in 9 in. skillet over medium heat for 2 minutes. Remove garlic. Sauté onion 5-7 minutes. Add wine; cook 3 minutes. Remove scallops. Whisk flour into pan juices; whisk in the half & half. Reduce heat; cook, stirring constantly until thickened and smooth, about 2 minutes. Season with salt and pepper.

Place reserved scallops in buttered 1½ quart casserole. Pour sauce over scallops.

Combine cracker crumbs, cheese and melted butter in small bowl. Sprinkle over scallops. Bake at 400 for about 15 minutes. Garnish with parsley.
