The Shell Clinic

This issue of Suncoast Shorelines features the Pear Whelk—Fulguropsis pyruloides. A member of the Busyconidae family, this univalve is common to our area, found from North Carolina to the Gulf Coast of Florida. This article first appeared (with a different Latin name—Busycon spiratum) in the first issue of our newsletter, March/April, 1989, by Bob Pierson, one of our founding members. The shell itself, like its common name Pear Whelk suggests, is pear-shaped. Its univalve shell is thin, but sturdy, and is characterized by its short, broad spire and sloping, angular shoulders. The aperture is wide, sloping to a long, straight, open siphonal canal. The surface has fine spiral sculpture patterns, with fuzzy tan to gray periostracum.

The Pear Whelk shell is creamy colored, with brown to purple broken spiral bands. This whelk's aperture is darker brown, and the lip is usually white. Pear Whelks, found in local waters, feed on hard-shell clams. The animal envelopes the clam in its foot, and by exerting a strong, steady pressure, forces the clam's valves apart. Then the Pear Whelk wedges the edge of its shell between the open valves and plunges its long proboscis deep into the soft part of the clam. Its diet is meager—about one clam per month.

Pear Whelks lay their eggs in long chains of capsules with one end anchored in the sand.



• May 31-June 4, 2023 - The 2023 COA Convention is returning to Wilmington, NC, hosted by the North Carolina Shell Club. The field trips will be on May 29 and 30. The Convention hotel is the Hotel Ballast, at same hotel as in 2014 and located in the heart of downtown Wilmington along the Boardwalk, Cape Fear River. Along with restaurants in hotel, there is shopping, dining, and entertainment within walking distance of the hotel. Hotel rate is \$154 (plus 13% tax) for 2 in a room; \$10 for each additional adult. The rate is good for May 29-June 4, 2023, and for 3 days pre/postconvention. The special rate only applies to reservations made no later than April 29, 2023. Self-parking fee is \$15 per night; valet parking \$20.
