



May 31-June 4, 2023 - The 2023 COA Convention is returning to Wilmington, NC, hosted by the North Carolina Shell Club. The field trips will be on May 29 and 30. The Convention hotel is the Hotel Ballast, at same hotel as in 2014 and located in the heart of downtown Wilmington along the Boardwalk, Cape Fear River. Along with restaurants in hotel, there is shopping, dining, and entertainment within walking distance of the hotel. Hotel rate is \$154 (plus 13% tax) for 2 in a room; \$10 for each additional adult. The rate is good for May 29-June 4, 2023, and for 3 days pre/postconvention. The special rate only applies to reservations made no later than April 29, 2023. Self-parking fee is \$15 per night; valet parking \$20.
