GEOPOLITICAL CONTEXT

Dubai as a Regional Safe Haven

The ongoing conflict in Gaza and broader regional tensions have redirected international visitor flows — with Dubai's political neutrality and security record drawing travellers and investors who might otherwise have chosen neighbouring destinations.
