Sate Deputies Message



Brothers we are just two weeks away from our 100th Convention and two and half months from the end of the Columbian year. I would like to thank each one of you for your hard work and dedication to the Knights of Columbus. Our goal for membership this year is 150 and as of April 1 we are at 80 new members. Twenty-one councils have recruited at

least one new member and fifteen councils have not recruited a new member so far this year. One Council has meet their membership quota (Msgr. McCarthy 5902) and several others are close to meeting their target. Let's keep up the challenging work and finish strong, a lot can be accomplished in two and a half months, don't forget our former members.

This year eighteen councils submitted program reports for judging. We have 36 active councils, that means 50% of the active councils submitted reports. Brothers I know most if not all Councils are active in some or all program areas. As leaders of your council you owe it to the members to report the work your council completes each year.

The Knights of Columbus started in Newfoundland and Labrador in 1909 with the formation of Dalton Council 1448 in Harbour Grace on November 29,1909. The second council was formed the next day with the formation of Terra Nova Council 1452 in St. John's. It would be nine years until the next council was formed at Bell Island on December 8, 1918

With the formation of Conception Council 1930, there were enough councils for the formation of a State Council. On May 24,1918 the first State Convention was held on Bell Island. In November, of 2008 we celebrated the 100th anniversary of the introduction of the Knights into the province. This year we will celebrate the 100th anniversary of the State council.

Archbishop Martin Currie, who is a former State Chaplain and a strong supporter of the Knights of Columbus will celebrate his Golden

Jubilee of Ordination to the Priesthood on Friday May 11, 2018. Let us all take this opportunity to congratulate Archbishop on reaching such a tremendous milestone when we see him at our convention.

Canada Summer Jobs program. The following is an update from Nat Gallo on efforts to change the Canada Summer Jobs application.

Groups applying for 2018 funding were required to endorse an attestation by checking a box, indicating their affirmation of certain beliefs held by the current government, described by many as a "values test." Such a values test contravenes the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms, which guarantees the freedom of religion and conscience (2a), of thought, belief, opinion and expression (2b), as well as "equal protection and equal benefit of the law without discrimination" (15 [1]).

In January of this year, we asked to sit down with the government to find a path forward. In the interim, we invited those sharing our deep concern to write, call or meet with their elected Member of Parliament, respectfully expressing these concerns. We know that more than 1,400 applications have been denied, compared to 126 in 2017. It is no coincidence that the number of rejections has spiked due to the controversial attestation.

Please take every opportunity to speak to your MP on this important issue.

As we approach the end of the current Columbian year I encourage all Grand Knights to ensure they complete all of the required forms for Supreme Council, especially those that may qualify for Star Council award.

Thank you and your families for all for the time and dedication that you give your councils and our order. I look forward to seeing many of you at our convention.

There is a handbook available from Supreme Office to aid Councils with home corporations in following this policy. I would urge Councils affected to follow this policy closely.

We should also keep in mind the Safe Environment Program Policy. Any member planning to serve in a youth role is required take the online Youth Protection and Safe Environment Training available at Supreme Office. This training is mandatory and Grand Knights should ensure this policy is followed.

Once again, this year at our convention we will adopt a number of resolutions to guide us for the upcoming Columbian year. A number of these are annual resolutions that are carried

forward every year while others are intended to provide guidance for programs and activities that our jurisdiction supports. I would like to thank the Councils that submitted resolutions this year and look forward to debating them with you at our convention later this month.

The Knights of Columbus operates under the Charter Constitution Laws, Knights of Columbus. This document outlines the laws of our order. I would encourage every council's Advocate to read and become familiar with these laws of our order and to ensure their council operates according to them.

It has been a great year for youth activities. I would like to thank all those who helped with those events. There was good participation in the state youth programs especially the free throw competitions.



A Century of Service for the Good of the Order and the Role of the Honor Guard

The Fourth Degree Emblem of the Knights of Columbus has a red cross with gold borders and gold knobs at the end points of the arms of the cross. It is known as the Isabella Cross. These knobs represent the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. The traditional corporal works includes the admonition to "bury the dead". The spiritual works advocate that we "comfort the afflicted" and "pray for the living and the dead."

We must always remember our deceased members, families and clergy. That is a core value in the 4th degree presence as Honor Guards at funerals of deceased members, family, and clergy. This practice helps us to live out our Faith while at the same time comforting families during difficult end of life experiences through the practice of these good Works.

This is a brief record of some of the Good of the Order actions in the Avalon area in 2017 to 2018. Present in varying arrays were Honor Guards from all nine Avalon Assemblies on each occasion comprising Howley, Rawlins, Roche, Dalton, Purcell and Cabot Assemblies. I know Assemblies beyond the Avalon and in Labrador have similar experiences and I invite them to record and share them.

The Honor Guard showed our deep respect for the Relic of St. Francis Xavier displayed at the Basilica, St. John's on 5 January 2018;
