The 2024 – 2025 has been a challenging, but rewarding year for the Knights of Columbus in Newfoundland and Labrador. I congratulate out going State Deputy Gary Gallagher and his executive team for their leadership during these challenging times. The office of State Advocate during the 2024 – 2025 Columbian year has dealt with a few minor issues, that in consultation with the executive and the council(s) involved were successfully mediated and resolved.

Your executive with our District Deputies continues to work with our councils Grand Knights on meeting specific program and reporting requirements such as the Columbian Award, Membership quotas, Insurance promotion-seminars and timely submission of required reports.

Our State Councils Organizational meetings were held July 12 - 14/2024 and once more were successful in the training of our new District Deputies and Grand Knights. Our executives business discussions set the tone for a good year.

This Columbian year saw the retirement of three St Joseph ICONs, which completed a three-year assignment touring Newfoundland and Labrador. Thank you, Mike Connolly and Jonathan Gaye, for coordinating the ICONs during their travel. The Catholic ICON supreme program features important catholic saints' images that is particularly edifying to Knights of Columbus and their communities. I congratulate the district deputies, our councils and churches that took the ICONs and promoted the faith to all who chose to have an encounter with St Joseph. They have all been successfully retired as we now promote the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus ICONs travels within our province. Supremes aim for this program to continue to foster greater devotion to the Sacred Heart among Knights and their communities. More than 191,000 council and parish prayer services with some 23 million participants have been held since the first traveling pilgrim icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe in 1979. There are currently two assigned to this jurisdiction. Mike Connolly is the current coordinator for the central (Grandfalls) and west

coast communities and I (Darrell Long) Central (Gander) Newfoundland east and Labrador. Each ICON has accompanying prayer cards and booklets as well as a journal, for tracking its travels. Your State executive encourages our members to promote the use of the ICON within our faith communities these next three years.

As State Advocate, it has been my pleasure to serve the order in this capacity. I recently in April attended a JUBLEE MENS LENTEN MISSION RETREAT sponsored by the Cathedral Basilica of St John the Baptist and its coordinator, the Vicar General Father Cecil Critch. It was exceptional with some 60-70 men in attendance. Many of them were young and the opportunity to recruit members was acted upon. Three new members were recruited and the spiritual rewards of the conference exceeded expectations. The presenter was Mr. Brett Powell who will return for a future retreat and I encourage members to

attend. I recommend members should endeavor to attend any programs being offered by our provincial dioceses when you can. It shows support for our faith community, deepens our own faith and provides fellowship and recruiting opportunities.

As State Advocate, I've assembled a Resolutions Committee for the 2024 - 2025 Columbian year. We will have the resolutions and by laws update ready for convention.

This does not sound impossible and if achieved, it would a great achievement for our jurisdiction and for our State Deputy, Gary Gallagher who has led us again this year. Remember Nike's slogan: JUST DO IT !! Thank you to all who have recruited this year and are still recruiting. District #1 is composed of 3 Councils which are active:

Avalon Council 2223 in Bay Roberts held its Election of Officers last spring. The District Deputy was invited to the Council's Columbus Day celebrations in November, and it was commendable to witness the service provided by this Council: support for the parish and parish priest, support for the community (Helping Hand: Goodwill Center and Food Bank), Coats for Kids, support for the Breakfast Programs in all area schools, support for the Guiding Movement, Scholarships for Children of Members, etc. Council reports are up to date, and most council leaders are compliant with the Knights of Columbus Safe Environment Program. The Council Chaplain is present at many council events.

Bishop Dalton Council 1448 held its Election of Officers last spring with most positions being filled. All Council Reports have been filed. This past year, the Council has been involved in many faith and church related activities like "Keep Christ in Christmas" in the Christmas Parade, Rosaries at wakes, supporting church celebrations, like the Feast of St. Joseph, leading the Stations of the Cross during Lent, and other ministries in the church, along with strong support for the Parish Priest. The Council also supports many of the Faith activities and prayer services of the Fourth Degree Dalton Assembly: good support and attendance for the "Prayer Service for Peace in our World," celebrating Flag Day at Sunday Mass, supporting the Memorial Mass for Deceased Members, and joining with Fourth Degree Honor Guards. The Council also participated in the Harbour Grace Pirates to Pilots Festival Open Doors, and is involved in programs with other community volunteers, for example, the maintenance of the Bennett's Lane Cemetery, a municipal heritage site.

Monsignor McCarthy Council **5902** held its Election of Officers last spring. The Council held an Awards Night in July, similar to Columbus Day. The Council is active in the Parish, regularly picking up the Sunday collection at St. Patrick's church. During the Christmas season, the Council took part in the Santa Claus parade, and held its Light up for Christ program at the beginning of Advent. Regular Council meetings are needed. That's where votes are held, and decisions are formally ratified. As well, reports like Audits reports need to be completed. The Council continues to work on programs like Coats for Kids, and is supportive of Parish events and celebrations, and often leads the Rosary at wake services. As well, the Council is very helpful with community events, and Fourth Degree activities.

All 3 Councils need to look at the challenge of attracting new members. The overall membership is declining, and neither Council has successfully recruited any members for a few years. Perhaps in the coming year, an increase in programs centered on our pillars of Faith, Family, Life, and Community will help to recruit new, committed members. There are a number of programs centered on Faith formation and development, including the COR program which is having success in other areas of the province. Other Knights of Columbus programs, like the Silver Rose, are easy to implement, and have had much success elsewhere. The new Pilgrim Icon Program centered on the Sacred Heart of Jesus is also a great way for Knights to enhance the Christian virtues envisioned by our founder, Blessed Michael McGivney: prayer, formation, and fraternity.

At the time of this writing Council was well over quota and Star council secure.

I am addressing the annual report of District #5. The district consists of three councils of the Knight of Columbus of Newfoundland and Labrador. The councils are Dean Patrick Cleary Council # 6672, Witless Bay, NL; Council #6494, St. Anne's Council, Dunville, NL; St. Mary's Council # 13320, St. Mary's Bay, NL.

Dean Patrick Cleary Council meet the first Monday of each month. Ten meetings during the year. They presently have a full and active executive. To date, there are no new members recruited this year. The Council is active in the parish community with collecting for Christmas hampers, seniors events, breakfast and visitations. They have a successful fundraiser through bingo. They have maintained their own council hall or (chamber). During the past four years, due to sickness and ageing and no new members, the council will struggle to form a full executive to conduct council business in the near future if membership doesn't increase. This is important to have a good functioning healthy council.

Council # 13320, St. Mary's Council, St. Mary's Bay, NL had six regular council meetings during the Colombia Year. The council was unsuccessful in recruiting any new members this year. The council has a full executive to conduct the council business, but due to sickness and age the council business is affected. The council meetings are held in the chapel wake room of St. Joseph's church, owned and operated by a private person or business. The council has recently received help through their new chaplain,

Fr. Nelson Born, who was recently appointed Pastor for St. Mary's Bay, Good Shepherd Parish. The council was involved with the two schools in this area with Keep Christ In Christmas banners and Free Throw basketball and possibly adding floor hockey in the coming year. The council was involved with fundraising for the parish expenses. They are also faithful to request from their usual charitable organizations. Again, I will say that if there are no new members it will be difficult to form a new executive to conduct the council business. Some of the KofC members are also involved with other organizations within the community like the Royal Canadian Legion and The Lions Club. The Knight of Columbus will need help in St. Mary's Bay.

Council 6494, St. Anne's, Dunville, NL

I recently spoke to Brother Doulas Power and he informed me that they presently have \$100.00 (One hundred dollars) in the council account with having the Supreme and State dues paid. As of that date he informed me that two members paid their yearly dues. He did not accept any tickets to sell for the Knight of Columbus Spring fundraiser. Last spring they sold 192, 50/50 raffle tickets and 3305 Fall Sweep tickets.

Ville Marie Council 10599 - Marystown.

Like other Councils Ville Marie Council in Marystown was very active. The following is just some of the council's activities from the past year. Council members serve the parish as ushers, collectors, lectors and help with church cleaning. One of the activities that this Council took part in was a Santa Claus parade. At this time they managed to raise 1227 pounds of food, along with \$145 in donations, which was donated to Helping Hands Family Aid food bank. The Council also donated \$500. Like other Councils they are having trouble selling their state tickets, not being able to take advantage of the many places they would normally be able to sell tickets in. Last spring Ville Marie Council sold 240, 50/50 raffle tickets and 1796 of the Fall Sweep tickets.

Some donations by the Council was \$200 to the Burin Peninsula Health Care Fdn. \$100 to the Janeway Telethon, \$100 to the Grace Sparks House playground, this is a support home for women. On July 1st, Council members participated in the Memorial Day parade and laid a wreath. Council donated \$50 to Sacred Heart Parish 2024 tree of memories in memory of deceased knights and wives.

Council members assisted Sacred Heart Parish with the annual fall fair on November 2nd. This is just a sample of the activities of Ville Marie Council 10599, Marystown.

It is with great pleasure that I submit this report on the activities and events which took place in District 10 during the past Columbian year. District 10 is comprised of three Councils; Our Lady of Perpetual Help Council 3742 in Stephenville (Grand Knight Conrad Benoit), P.J. Cooney Council 9789 in Codroy (Grand Knight Frank Aucoin) and Our Lady of Assumption Council 9464 in Stephenville Crossing (Grand Knight John Brake). During the past year I have visited each of these Councils and conducted their installation of officers. I am in regular contact with the Grand Knights and we work together to resolve any issues or problems as they arise.

OLPH Council 3742

With the Grand Knight into his third year this Council continues to be a very strong performer; running a full range of faith in action programs in all four categories for which program reports have been submitted. Through local bingo and the Toonie Toss fundraiser, as well as ticket revenue and dues, this Council has outstanding fundraising capacity which it uses mainly to support parish activities and infrastructure as well as community charitable activities. In St Stephens Parish, The Knights of Columbus are certainly the organization that can always be relied upon to take on short notice tasks big or small. The Council has recruited 6 new members so far this year and should have no problem filling a slate of officers in the next Columbian year. Cooperation with the Parish is very good as the parish priest, Father Joseph is now the Council Chaplain as Father Maurice O'Quinn recently retired from that position. Overall, this continues to be a strong Council with no major issues.

PJ Cooney Council 9789

This is a small Council in a rural area with a dwindling membership. While they managed to recruit one new member this past year, recruitment efforts are lacking and it is difficult to find qualified people to fill executive positions. This Council almost folded this year when the Grand Knight resigned but I was able to convince them to elect a new Grand Knight and carry on. This past year

their awards night and dinner was very well done. I also attended the funeral of a long-time member of the Council, Brother Bernie Benoit, which was also well done with proper respects shown by all Brother Knights in attendance. The Council runs very limited programs except for two major community activities each year: the winter carnival and summer folk festival which provides them with sufficient funding. They also do not appear to have a good working relationship with their Parish Priest who is also their Chaplain. Overall, this is a weak Council barely able to find executive members and sustain itself. While there are some glimmers of hope, without future recruitment it may be necessary to downgrade their status to a Round Table.

Our Lady of the Assumption Council 9464

This is a small but very active Council which has strong and mature leadership from their new Grand Knight, Brother John Brake. Their Council meetings are always well organized and conducted according to protocol. The Council runs several small but effective programs within their means including a community café, bingo, and support for a small food bank. They have a working relationship with the parish and conduct small construction projects to help maintain the church as required. The Grand Knight will be attending the State Convention this year for the fist time as he continues to grow in this leadership position. Overall, this is a small but effective Council with a positive impact in the parish and community. They have shown the potential to grasp change, grow in size and expand their programs. They are to be commended for a very challenging but successful year.

Conclusion

District 10 has had a very busy year with the Knights of Columbus front and center in their respective parishes and communities. Recruitment continues to be a challenge particularly in the two smaller Councils with an older population and higher attrition rates. Nonetheless we must overcome these challenges if our Councils are to survive. In recent months OLPH Council has made in roads into some of our immigrant communities for recruitment, a relatively untapped resource. It is also a truism that good programs provide good recruitment opportunities and we need to continue to raise our profile through public announcements and wearing Knights of Columbus apparel at public events. The 4th Degree Honour Guard is also a key element of the public image of the Knights of Columbus and should be utilized at every opportunity.

The lack of a full time insurance agent on the West Coast is also a big challenge. With only one left in the entire province the viability of the insurance program (sometimes a major factor in recruitment) in this area is in question.



2024 - 2025 Special Olympics Report

The vision of the Special Olympics is that sport will open hearts and minds towards people with intellectual disabilities and create inclusive communities. With this in mind, the Knights of Columbus is a proud supporter of the Special Olympics.

Special Olympics (S.O.) competitions both provincially and nationally take place every year. These include local competitions and the Special Olympics Newfoundland & Labrador Provincial Games. In addition to the fun, exciting and competitive experience these games also serve as the qualifying competition, providing an opportunity for our athletes to qualify as a member of Team NL. As a member of Team NL, they are eligible to advance to compete at the Special Olympics Canada National Games and potentially as a member of Team Canada in Special Olympics World Games. The World Games are the flagship event for the Special Olympics movement and take place every two years, alternating between summer and winter Games.

In February 2025, the Special Olympics World Winter Games were held in Turin, Italy. Team NL comprised of S.O. athletes from this jurisdiction took part in these games and brought home the medals to prove it.

Additionally, Special Olympics Newfoundland and Labrador will proudly host the Provincial Summer Games in the welcoming Town of Gander from July 3rd - 6th, 2025. All councils in the jurisdiction are encouraged to support our S.O. athletes and teams during these upcoming games.

In addition to the provincial games, Special Olympics Newfoundland & Labrador offers different programs for athletes and their families such as the Fit Family and Friends program.

It is important to remember that all councils are required to submit their <u>Fraternal Programs Report Form (#10784</u>) for Special Olympics to Supreme by January 31st of each year and submit a copy of it to the state executive and the S. O. Chairman. Councils are also asked to report individual S.O. activities via form # 10784 to Supreme, State Council and the S. O. Chairman as soon as possible following the date of the activities. It is very important that Councils keep in mind that the reporting of individual S.O. programs during the Columbian year does not relieve any council of its responsibility to submit form #10784 by January 31st of each year.

Unfortunely, not all active councils in this jurisdiction are reporting their S.O. involvement and support of S.O. activities in their local areas. To date only two councils have reported being involved in or plan to be involved in any S.O. programs within their local areas during this fraternal year:

- Terra Nova Council 1452 has reported donating approximately \$10,500.00 in kind to special Olympics via the use
 of there building for such things as dances, concerts, practices and bingos. Additionally, they catered three
 special Olympics functions at considerably reduced rates.
- Archbishop Howley Council 2581 helped sponsored a Christmas dinner for a local special Olympics group. In total council contributed \$500.00 and approximately forty person hours to the group. This included preparing, serving and cleaning up after the meal.

It is important for all Grand Knights to keep in mind that the amount of funding provided to the State Council, by the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council for Special Olympics Newfoundland and Labrador, is based on the value of the reported number of volunteer hours, financial support and programs provided by councils in the jurisdiction.

ONLINE MEMBERSHIP in the Knights of Columbus was introduced in 2017 to allow Catholic men to join the Knights of Columbus by completing an online application and short ceremonial. These men would then be Associate Members under the jurisdiction of the local State Council. Men who entered the Order through the online initiation would be permitted to purchase insurance, even though they have not taken the First Degree, and the Supreme Secretary would issue a membership card to these new Brother Knights.

Every state council is authorized to accept members through the online membership initiative. The Supreme Council office administers the state divisions, including the collection of dues and the issuance of membership cards.

Men who join the Order through the online membership initiative do not form a new class or type of member. Therefore, as members of the Knights of Columbus they are entitled to the rights and privileges of membership, which include being eligible:

- to attend local, state, and Supreme Council events,
- to attend local council meetings as nonvoting participants,
- to receive fraternal benefits,
- to purchase Knights of Columbus financial products and services, and
- to receive the Columbia magazine and other Supreme Council publications.

Men who join the Order online are encouraged to attend local council business meetings, and encouraged to become members of that council.

As of April 11th this year, 32 new members have joined online in NL. Only 10 have migrated to a local council so far. Our all-time intake for Online Membership is 180, with 100 of these Brother Knights so far converting or migrating to a local Council.

Please consider promoting Online Membership, and encourage Online Members to join a local Council as soon as possible.

State Lottery 2024

During our State Lottery campaign of 2024 there were 5068 tickets sold. The gross income from these sales was \$ 126,700.00, the prize being \$ 63,350.00. The winner was Bobbi Jo Pickett of Wabush, seller – Bobbi Jo Pickett. Ticket #8316

Last year, 30 out of 34 Councils returned sold tickets. 19 Councils sold less tickets, than they did previous year and 11 Councils sold more than the previous year.

Compared to 2023 State Lottery, 746 less tickets were sold, a decrease of \$ 18,650.00 in sales. In 2023 there were 5814 tickets sold, with a gross income of \$ 145,350.00

Fall Ticket Sweep 2024

This past fall we once again went with a \$2 each or 3 for \$5 lottery. A breakdown of each region is as follows.

Region "A" from the east Coast to central stopping at Gander consisted of 18 councils. A breakdown of last year's sales are as follows.

21,717 tickets were sold. Ticket income \$36,260. 16 of 18 councils sold tickets.

Region "B" consists of councils from Grand Falls-Winsor area, south coast, western Newfoundland and Labrador, consists of 16 councils.

18,125 tickets were sold. Ticket income \$27,303. 13 of 16 councils sold tickets.

Ticket prizes for each region was \$7000.00 1st prize - \$5000, 2nd prize -\$1000, 3rd prize - \$500, with \$500 going to the seller of the 1st prize. Total prize money was \$14,000.00
