Brothers we are just two weeks away from our 101th Convention and two and half months from the end of the Columbian year. I would like to thank each and every one of you for your hard work and dedication to the Knights of Columbus.

"History of Lent"

By the time you read this Lent will almost be completed. I received the article below from Ron Schuster, State Deputy of Alberta and I thought it was well worth sharing with you.

Early Christians felt the importance of Easter called for special preparations. The first mention of a 40-day period of fasting in preparation for Easter is found in the Canons of Nicaea (AD 325). It is thought the tradition may have grown from the early church practice of baptismal candidates undergoing a 40-day period of fasting in preparation for their baptism at Easter. Eventually, the season evolved into a period of spiritual devotion for the whole church. During the initial centuries, the Lenten fast was very strict but relaxed over time.

Lent is the Christian season of preparation before Easter. The Lenten season is a time when many Christians observe a period of fasting, repentance, moderation, self-denial and spiritual discipline. The purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ – his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death and resurrection.

Many Catholics or other Churches that observe Lent, celebrate Shrove Tuesday. Traditionally, pancakes are eaten on Shrove Tuesday (the day before Ash Wednesday) to use up rich foods like eggs and dairy in anticipation of the 40-day fasting season of Lent. Shrove Tuesday is also called Fat Tuesday or Mardi Gras, which is French for Fat Tuesday. During the six weeks of self-examination and reflection, Christians who observe Lent typically make a commitment to fast, or to give up something – a habit, such as smoking, watching TV, swearing, or a food or drink, such as sweets,

chocolate, or coffee. Some Christians also take on a Lenten discipline, such as reading the Bible and spending more time in prayer to draw nearer to God.

Strict observers do not eat meat on Fridays, often opting for fish instead. The goal of these spiritual disciplines is to strengthen the faith of the observer and develop a closer relationship with God.

Thank you and your families for all the time and dedication that you give your councils and our order. I look forward to seeing many of you at our convention.

I would like to take this time to wish each and every Brother knight and their families a Blessed and Holy Easter.

A pagan celebration that worshipped the goddess Eastre. She was the goddess of fertility and springtime and her earthly symbol was the rabbit. Thus, the pre-Christian Anglo-Saxons worshipped the rabbit believing it to be Eastre's earthly incarnation.

When the Anglo-Saxons were converted to Christianity, the pagan holiday, which occurred around the same time as the Christian memorial of Jesus' resurrection from the dead, was combined with the Christian celebration and given the name Easter.

Originally, there were some very pagan practices that went along with the Easter celebration. Today, Easter is often commercialized, with all the focus on eggs, the Easter bunny, etc.

Because of this, many churches are starting to refer to it as Resurrection Day.

Financial Secretaries Training Corner

The system is great for recording all your financial transactions and this gives you a broad range of reporting. Once you identify your reports needs and record your income and expenses in the system, the reports

These reports are available within minutes and can be tailored to your requirements. Masters Report

Numbers? This overview is described in Arabic figures. My answers when people ask, "Well how big is the 4th Degree and are they all over the world?" The answers are yes of course its big and universal. And here are the numbers. There are 4 Divisions of the 4th Degree in the world. Division IV, to which we belong, has Provinces with 7000 or less members. The divisions are divided into Provinces and the Provinces into Districts. I am the Master of the Newfoundland Labrador District. Our district is one of four in

the Most Rev Francis C. Kelley Province. New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island comprise our brother Districts in Atlantic Canada. And we are one of four Districts in our Province. And our Province is one of the six that comprise Division IV. See what I mean by numbers.

In our geographical area there are, as of January 31, 2019, in total, 23,706 Brother Knights with only 4,991 Sir Knights. This means 18,715 brothers are not 4th Degree Knights - about 21% actually. The members of the Honor Guards represent some 10% of that number.

The First Division is made up of Provinces with more than 20,000 members. That Division has over a million Knights but only 204,813 Sir Knights - again about 20 % with 10% in Honor Guards.

The Supreme Master reported last summer that on 1 July 2017 the 4th Degree membership total was 258,907, 18.4% of the Orders total Membership. As of 30 June 2018, the number of Sir Knights increased to 363,131 increasing to 18.5% of total membership. Slow growth for sure. He said we need at least a 2% growth increase each year over death and suspensions.

Here is an overview of the age and membership parameters in the Order: 18-29 = 6,643; 30-44 = 28591; 45-64 = 137,956; and over 65 = 185,707. The average age of a 4th Degree member is 64.

So, we ask these perennial questions: Why do men join the 4th Degree or not? How do we attract new members to the Patriotic Degree? And we have only one source the 3rd Degree. So "Houston we have a Problem."

On 1 July 2018 there were 5,264 Brother Knights in Newfoundland Labrador with only 1,110 of them being members of the Fourth degree. The distribution was as follows:

In support of the faith life of our Brother Knights, their families and parish communities, the Knights of Columbus encourages Grand Knights to promote faith-based activities in their councils. A number of activities are recommended.

Councils are encouraged to help build the Domestic Church, most notably by setting up a Kiosk of faith-based literature in the Parish Church with documentation available from the Catholic Information Service. Steps to take on this dossier are outlined in the booklet distributed to you by the State Council.

A second activity encouraged by the Supreme Council includes the organization of regular Holy Hours. While I doubt that this activity will appeal to many Knights in Newfoundland and Labrador today, I encourage those interested to contact your Parish Priest to organize a first Holy Hour in order to gauge interest.

In a third activity recommended by the Supreme Council, Councils are encouraged to form discussion groups for the study of Into the Breach, an apostolic exhortation by Bishop Thomas J. Olmsted. This exhortation outlines the challenges faced by men of faith in the world today. Again, details for the organization of study groups may be obtained through your Grand Knight.

Other programs recommended by the Supreme Council include the Marian Icon and Rosary Programs, as well as the RSVP programs. The first two speak for themselves and the third involves support for seminarians and other religious vocations. For every \$500 donated to

an individual seminarian, the Supreme Council will refund \$100 back to the council - up to a maximum of \$400 per council per fraternal year. If you have donated money and have not already requested your refund, I urge you to do so, at your earliest convenience.
