Message from State Treasurer



Brothers, the first half of the 2018-2019 Columbian year is drawing to a close and we have just returned from our annual Winter meetings in Gander

where we had our annual Fall Sweep ticket draw. Sales from this lottery were up by 6000 tickets this year. I am pleased that all councils have paid their First Half Assessments for 2018-2019 and are in good standing with State.

I would like to remind all Grand Knights that the Second Half Assessments will be mailed to each council in early January and I would encourage all councils to pay their assessments as soon as possible after you receive the invoice to ensure that council members continue to remain eligible

for the fraternal benefits offered by Supreme and State. These benefits include Scholarships, the Member Medical Travel Fund and the Children's Hostel Sick Benefits.

Just a reminder that members <u>in good standing</u> are eligible to receive up to a maximum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) a year under the Members Medical Travel Fund. Members required to travel more than 100 kms from their home for medical treatment are reimbursed at the rate of .06 cents per kilometre from their home council to the community where they have the medical appointment. The Newfoundland Statistics Website is used to determine the number of kilometres travelled.

Also, the Sick Children's Hostel Fund is available to eligible members <u>in good standing</u> up to a total of five hundred dollars (\$ 500.00) per year. Any member wishing to find out more information on the Members' Medical Travel Fund and the Children's Hostel Sick Benefits, or to determine if they can avail of the Fund or Sick benefits, can contact their Grand Knight or Financial Secretary.

On behalf of your State Lottery Committee, I want to urge all councils to get actively involved in our second half major fund-raising venture: the \$40.00 STATE LOTTERY. Last year we saw an increase of 300 in ticket sales over the previous year. This initiative, as well as the Fall Sweep, is vital to your councils and the State Council if we are to continue on a positive financial path into the future. Increased revenue will ensure that your council and State Council will be able continue with many of our programs that are now in place and may provide the opportunity to improve or add new programs.

On behalf of my family, I want to wish all councils and individual members a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. Just remember

to KEEP CHRIST IN CHRISTMAS.

Free Throw Championship

Worthy Grand Knights and Financial Secretary Some councils in the near future may be planning to have a Basketball Free throw Championships in their local school.

There are 'kits' which have to be ordered which have all the supplies necessary to conduct the local runoffs. If there are more than one school in one Councils area, only individual winners in the various age categories will be awarded a medal To get these kits the FS or GK are the only people who can order kits. There is **no charge for these kits including shipping.** However, you may be asked, or not asked, for a credit card number. You may have to supply this in order for the kits to be shipped. An independent company called WEBMASON is the company in charge of delivering the kits for Supreme. Most other supplies are shipped directly from Supreme which includes orders thru Knights On-Line like shirts etc.

They indicate that up to 4 weeks lead time is necessary so kits should be ordered now if your council is conducting this program.

Remember the Free Throw Championship is one of the programs listed under the Community featured programs and constitutes one credit of the four credits needed to complete the Community programs. Grand Knight Gerry Puddister of St. Paul's Council 11776 has mentioned that he has had great success with this program in schools in his area.

He mentioned at the Gander meeting that many Phys Ed instructors at schools are looking for programs to run during the day and find this program ideal. Direct contact with the Phys Ed instructor works best he says.

Dalton Council/Assembly

How many Councils and Assemblies today can say that they attended and held an Honor Guard at their namesake's burial when he died 149 years ago? Dalton Council #1448 and Dalton Assembly #1645 can.

Their namesake, Bishop John Dalton was born in Thurles, County Tipperary, in 1821. In 1839 he left Ireland for Newfoundland, where his uncle, Charles Dalton, O.S.F., a Friar Minor, was serving as the parish priest of Immaculate Conception Parish in Harbour Grace. The following year, John entered the Franciscan Order and was sent to study at St. Isidore's College in Rome, the seminary of the Irish friars of the Order. He was ordained a Catholic priest there in 1846.

Bishop Dalton returned to Newfoundland that same year. He was assigned as a curate by Michael Anthony Fleming, O.S.F., the Vicar Apostolic of Newfoundland, to assist his uncle by caring for the congregation of St. Patrick's Parish in Carbonear. When Charles Dalton was later transferred to Harbour Grace, John became parish priest in Carbonear.

In early 1856, the Diocese of St. John's, Newfoundland, was divided by the Holy See to form the new Diocese of Harbour Grace, and Bishop Dalton was appointed by Pope Pius IX on February 29 as its first bishop. He was ordained a bishop on May 25 of that year by John Thomas Mullock, O.F.M. Bishop of St. John's.

For the first few years Bishop Dalton continued to live in Carbonear but, following the death of his uncle, he moved in 1860 to the rectory in Harbour Grace. He spent the rest of his

administration working to establish the structures of the diocese, including commencement of the construction of a cathedral for his diocese. He was also active in the local politics of the province. One of his first acts as bishop had been to ordain a native of Newfoundland as a priest.

Bishop Dalton died in his post in 1869. His remains were interred under the main altar of the Immaculate Conception Cathedral, built in 1892.

On September 14, 2018 Dalton Council and Dalton Assembly participated in another episode of Immaculate Conception Cathedral's history with the exhumation of Bishop Dalton, along with the Donnelly family from the crypt and burial in the Harbour Grace Roman Catholic Cemetery.

Upon the announcement to the Immaculate Conception parishioners on Sunday 9 September that the remains of Bishop Dalton and the Donnelly Family would be exhumed and relocated in the cemetery, members of both Dalton Council and Dalton Assembly reacted promptly to ensure that the proper respects be paid to their namesake.

Sir Knight Aiden Moriarty quickly advised Faithful Navigator Paul Baldwin, and both set in motion the wheels to get the Honor Guard and Council involved. Faithful Master Derm Whalen was advised and was instrumental in getting the word to other Assemblies.

Neighboring Monsignor McCarthy Council quickly came on board with Dalton Council and provided 3rd Degree members to help and provide pallbearers. Cabot Assembly and Monsignor Rawlins Assembly augmented Dalton Assembly 4th Degree Honor Guard ensuring a proper guard for such a historic occasion. Bishop Daniels, Bishop of Grand Falls celebrated the burial of the Donnelly Family and Bishop Dalton. There were numerous priests present from the diocese aiding Bishop Daniels.

Upon completion of the burials, Dalton Council hosted all to food and refreshments. A great way to end a historic day of the Knights of Columbus in Newfoundland and Labrador.
