Brother Knights, we are almost to the end of the Columbian year 2018-2019. Just over a month ago we held a successful State Convention in

of Gander with our councils most participating. The next step is the Supreme Convention that is being held in Minneapolis, Minnesota in early August. I will be one of delegates attending this Supreme the Convention and I look forward to an enjoyable and informative few days of fraternity with our jurisdiction's delegation as well as all the worldwide jurisdictions.

As this year closes, we are gearing up for the new year which starts July 1, 2019 and business will start as usual. Early in July, your councils will be sent First Half Assessments for the new year by our State Secretary, yours truly, and I encourage all councils to please submit payment in a timely manner, as most councils are accustomed to doing.

This past year our revenue from our \$ 40.00 State Lottery tickets was down from last year's revenue but we saw an increase in the sale of the Fall Sweep tickets. The result overall was just a little less than last year's total count. At this time councils should be in possession of the Fall Sweep tickets and I would encourage councils to distribute those tickets as early as possible so as to get a jump on sales during the Summer months when people are visiting from away and there are plenty of activities such as garden parties, music festivals and other group gatherings taking place. On a housekeeping note, I would like to remind councils of the change of the year-end date for the Member Medical Travel Fund to coincide with the end of the fiscal year on February 28, was passed in Resolution at State as Convention 2018. The current claim period is from March 01, 2019- February 28, 2020 with a grace period for claims up to the end of March 2020. I want to encourage all the council who send in medical requests to please send them in a timely manner instead of waiting until you have several requests at the same time. This makes the accounting process much easier and gets the funds replenished to your councils' accounts on a regular and faster basis. If you wait too long, the funds allocated for that time period may not available due to being already paid out or too late for the claim period. In the past two (2) years, as your State Treasurer, I have tried to be very prompt with getting claims processed and back to councils. I also want to thank those councils that were very cooperative in those matters by submitting their claims as they received them from eligible members.

Just a note to remind councils to send any claims that you received after the end of June 2019, from the Member Medical Fund, to the incoming State Treasurer, Brother Gary Gallagher.

On behalf of State, I want to thank everyone for your cooperation and understanding during the past two (2) years and for the confidence you have placed in me by voting me into the position of State Secretary at our Annual State Convention in Gander. I look forward to continuing to serve your councils next year in that capacity.

Just a friendly reminder that our two (2) fund raisers: State Lottery and Fall Sweepstake, are

our life blood from a financial point of view and we should make a concerted effort to make 2019-2020 a banner year in ticket sales in our jurisdiction if we hope to maintain our level of financial support to our councils and the many groups and organizations we support on a regular basis.

There were 391 tickets less sold this year than last year. This year there were 6945 State Lottery tickets sold.
