You, the members of the Knights of Columbus of today, step into the breach and face those challenges by leading your families, and your parish community, to live the faith at home with weekly and monthly prayers, reflections, and activities so they, and you, can grow in holiness together.

For the past six months, councils have not been able to, or have been reluctant, to gather on a regular basis, face to face, because of Public Health protocols and regulations put in place to deal with Covid19.

Those regulations and protocols are now being relaxed, and as such, it is now easier for councils to resume face to face meetings. However, the decision to resume face to face meetings, is entirely up to the individual council. Neither the State Executive nor the Supreme Council will interfere with any council decision regarding face to face meetings while the Covid-19 crisis remains.

But I would point out that councils throughout the Knights of Columbus world are finding ways to conduct business, while practicing appropriate social distancing and following local and federal Public health protocols.

Bothers, on another note, our founder, Father Michael McGivney, will be beatified and declared Blessed in special ceremonies in New haven in less than seven weeks.

Father McGivney's impending beatification gives us an opportunity to tell our story to an audience of Catholic men who will surely find his story – our story – compelling. Let us take advantage of that opportunity by extending an invitation to the Catholic men in our parishes to join the Order. You will likely have to step outside the box though and find new ways of touching base with these men while Covid19 regulations and protocols remain in place. That is the challenge. Are you up for it?

Brothers, I wish to thank each, and everyone, of you, and your families for all you have given, and continue to give, to your councils and our order. Stay safe, and May God watch over and protect you.

A note regarding this has been sent out to the Grand Knights. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

There will be more correspondences forthcoming in regards to events taking place such as our Mid-Year meetings and State Convention, 2021, as we draw closer to these dates.

Let's hope that we can find ways to continue the works of the Knights of Columbus in each of our councils and have a successful year.

Greetings Brother Knights

Thank you to all councils who despite this epidemic have tried to run programs and generate funds for their own councils as well as contribute

funds to our state sponsored programs as well. Your State Council has been using virtual meeting programs like Zoom and GoTo Meeting to have regular meetings. If you haven't used them thus far and would like to try one, I would be glad to facilitate one for you.

Recently your State Council has made financial donations to The Gathering Place (\$3000), who are working on a new emergency shelter for the homelessness in St. John's, The Center for Life (\$2000) who are working on a new program to assist women contemplating or after having an abortion, the Catholic Missions of Canada who have priests in this province. And finally, a donation of (\$5000) to the Special Olympics of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Your State Council also distributed cash awards to fourteen winners of State sponsored essay's and colouring contests to students all over the Province. To date I have received over twenty payments of the 1st half assessments, which include Council membership assessment as well as your portion of Liability Insurance. Your State Deputy and State Council felt that due to lack of funding opportunities within Councils and additional savings by having virtual meetings for your State Board we could reduce your first half assessment by 50%. You will notice this reduction in fees shown on your statement. Thank you for your prompt payments.

Our Fall Fundraiser Lottery is now in full swing. We are selling our \$1.00 tickets. For every ticket sold your council receives a 50/cent rebate. An excellent way for Councils to generate funds during this pandemic. They are an easy sell to family and friends. We depend on your continued support to carry out Knights of Columbus work in the Province. Good luck and stay safe as we go into the fall season.

Beatification



On May 26, 2020, Pope Francis approved a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to the intercession of Father McGivney. A much-anticipated step toward sainthood, the pope's approval opens the way for Father McGivney to be beatified and declared Blessed.

With the approval of a miracle, Father McGivney will be raised to the honors of the altar during a Mass of Beatification on October 31, 2020, at the Cathedral of Saint Joseph in Hartford, after which the founder of the Knights of Columbus will be known as Blessed Michael McGivney. This ceremony will be live streamed. More information on this to come out shortly.

A second confirmed miracle through the intercession of Father McGivney is needed for canonization and sainthood.

All Knights and their families, as well as all those devoted to Father McGivney, are asked to pray for his intercession in their daily needs, especially in cases of serious illness, and to report any favors and healings to the Guild.
