

CIVIC MEETING MINUTES
APRIL 5, 2016

Everyone stood for the Pledge of Allegiance. The meeting was called to order and the minutes were read and approved.

Ms. Diller reported a problem with the dumpsters and overflowing trash at 37 Carlisle which was reported and taken care of. We have 19 code issues mostly high grass and weeds. The crime report showed four abandoned vehicles, five false alarms, four burglaries with three written reports, four domestic violence with one arrests, one drug violation with one arrest, one missing person, one capias on a pedestrian stop, four suspicious persons two with capias and a warning, one stolen vehicle, one theft, 30 vehicle stops with 17 citations and 13 warnings. Ms. Diller handed out her newsletter and announced that the Brookside School will have the half day program this summer for kids 5 to 12 years old. A resident ask if she dealt with the board of realtors because we want to reinforce the issue of letting clients know dues are mandatory in Brookside and that outstanding dues need to be collected at settlement. She suggested putting liens on the delinquent properties. She will check with the board of realtors about this issue. She will also check on the burnt out house at 44 Kullen Dr.

A resident reported that the trash can in Freedom Field needs emptied. Vic announced that Cool Run Creek project has been completed and that the community will be doing some upgrades. It was brought to the attention of the board that the excess money in our account needs to be invested back into our community or we could lose the non-profit status. Therefore we are planning on putting in new playground equipment, redoing the basketball - tennis courts, a walking trail, and a message board. The Baseball opening day is April 16. There are new history pages on the web site with pictures back to 1953. Vic encouraged everyone to sign up for mailers on the web site at brooksidede.org and to sign up for Next door Brookside. A special meeting will be scheduled for the 2016 - 2017 financials. Brookside's Clean-Up day is May 7th with a dumpster in the parking lot from 7 to 11:30. Volunteers needed. Two trucks will be in the development for curb side pickup - Have your stuff out early. Heard on the streets: Shop Rite is going to be expanding and remodeling the Chestnut Hill Store. Senator Townsend is running for congress. He opened his main office on Main St. The primary is Tuesday September 13th. The Christiana Referendum passed and the schools have a lot of challenges so hopefully they will turn around.
