MAGGIE WALSH

Maggie Walsh, former English teacher, left teaching due to feeling unsafe and unsupported, is now a full-time law student at the University of Miami where she utilizes her professional skills to advocate for social justice. Maggie Walsh was an English educator at Miami Carol City Senior High School for two-and-a-half years. During that time, she prepared 9th graders for English language curriculum using effective lesson plans and weekly assessments. She left back in 2021 after she didn't feel safe and was not being supported as a teacher. Walsh is now a full-time law student at University of Miami where she brings in her professional skills to advocate social justice.





CYDNEY EDWARDS

Cydney Edwards is a social justice activist and educator who primarily focuses on the practice of art and debate to boost the confidence of students before they head off to college. She currently teaches at the University of Wisconsin-Madison as the Associate Director of The Office of Multicultural Arts Initiatives where she mostly works with African American students who are in low-income neighborhoods.

KHORTLAN BECTON

Khortlan earned her BAs in African American Studies and Religious Studies from the University of Alabama, a Master of Theological Studies from Vanderbilt Divinity School, and a Juris Doctor from Temple University Beasley School of Law. Becton is cofounder of the Restorative Education Institute. Her research interests include social justice, algorithmic bias and discrimination, and educational equity.

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
