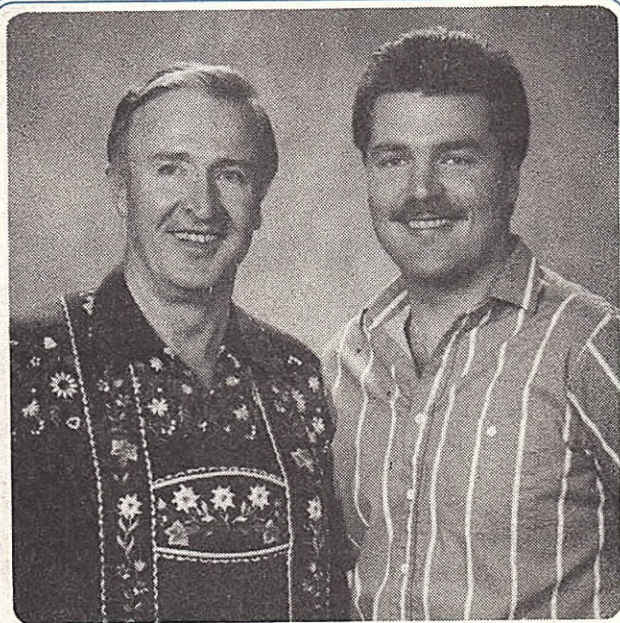

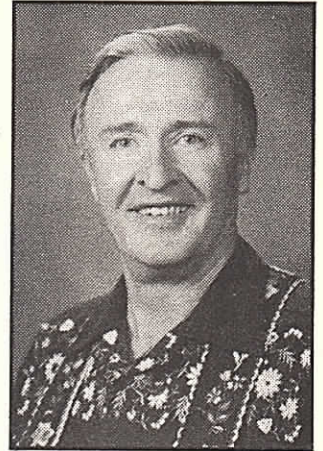

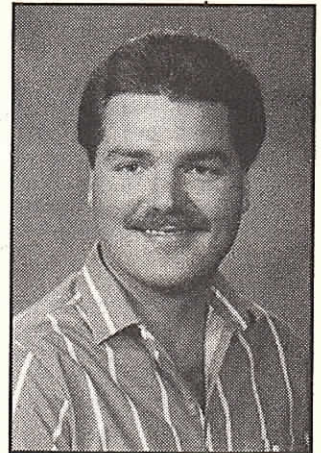
Marv Herzog

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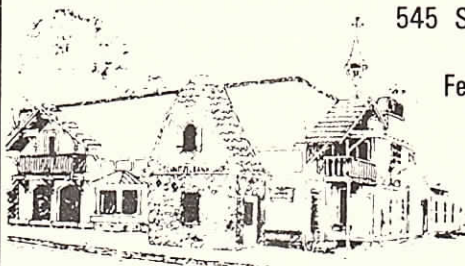
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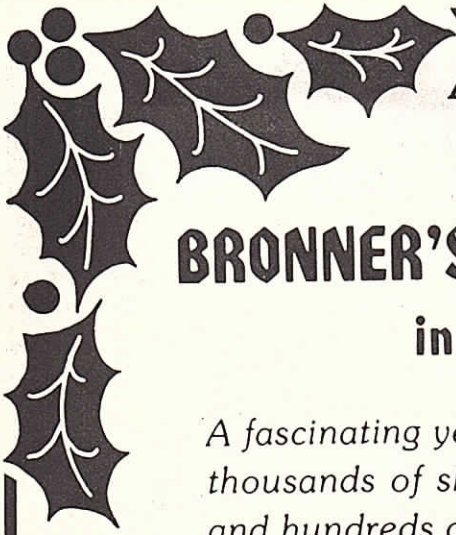


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DUTCH-HOP MUSIC

Al Holman and the Polkatoons



Al Holman and the Polkatoons, from Loveland, Colorado, present a unique sound that is easy to listen to and fun to dance to. Organized in 1969 at a house party, they attained recognition quickly with their special style of Dutch-Hop German music, making them a major attraction at festivals in the states surrounding their home.

They have promoted various tours to Europe entertaining in countries such as Germany, Austria, Switzerland and Holland. Another successful venture for Al and son Dennis has been the formation of a recording studio, Holman Sound Productions. All the sound equipment, recording, engineering, mixing and editing are

products of this company. They have recorded eleven albums and are currently working on a twelfth.

Members of the band are: Al Holman - accordion; Dennis Holman - vocals and electronic piano; Rod Deines - hammer dulcimer, drums, saxophone and vocals; and Al Windholz - trombone.

The Polkatoon's popularity has already been established in Michigan and Ohio, appearing to sell-out crowds in recent years. They are the featured attraction the first weekend of the Summer Music Fest, August 12, 13 and 14. See what the excitement is all about when this band hits town.

Scrubby and the Dyna-Tones



The year was 1968, when the Dyna-Tones first graced the polka scene with their presence. Their lively style has brought them a popularity unlike any other Polish style polka band. With the hit song "Zosia" they became renowned in the festival world, and their antics on stage have kept them a favorite among festival goers.

After a three year sabbatical, the Dyna-Tones regrouped and are now on a 20th anniversary

reunion tour. Members of the band are Dave "Scrubby" Seweryniak - concertina and vocals; Larry Trojak - drums and vocals; Dave "Nigel" Kurdziel - bass; Tommy Picciano - trumpet and vocals; Mike Burka - trumpet and vocals; and Kevin Kurdziel - accordian.

The Dyna-Tones will be on stage for all to see and enjoy Friday and Saturday, August 12 and 13 at the Summer Music Fest in Frankenmuth.

Steve Drzewicki and Friends

After some forty years, the name Drzewicki is still well-known in the mid-Michigan area. Many polka fans remember Polka Stan Drzewicki, his friendly radio voice and his fine band. But now Steve is working to keep the Drzewicki name going strong. The group, from Bay City, Michigan, consists of five experienced musicians from diverse backgrounds who have combined to create a new hard driving polka variety act.

Steve, who is a polka DJ on WKCQ in Saginaw, plays drums and has worked the night club circuit in Top 40 and Country, as well as playing in his Uncle Stan's band since the age of 12.

Gary Mueller, who has recorded with many different acts, enjoys working night clubs between his polka jobs, plays sax, trumpet, bass and a mean fiddle.

Dan "Hoogie" Hoogland got his start in some of Chicago's best known night clubs, has played with many well known names in the current Top

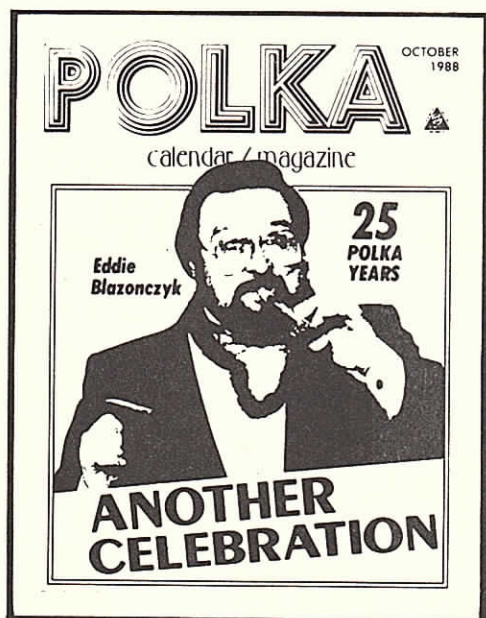
40 world and is currently writing some new tunes for an upcoming album. Hoogie plays sax, bass guitar, keyboards, and is a strong vocalist.

Bill Trieshell, who plays accordion and keyboard, has been with the Drzewicki band for twelve years and is *the Boxman* that every good polka band needs.

Mike Corbin plays several instruments, studied and played jazz, has a music degree, and adds that special touch for that Big Band sound.

The group has incorporated some 50's and 60's songs in their repertoire and have become so popular with them that every 50's and 60's dance they have sponsored has been a sell-out.

Steve Drzewicki and Friends are bringing new faces to the polka world by adding all types of music to their polka dances. They are a band worth coming out to see. They will be appearing at the Summer Music Fest on Friday, August 12.



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Czech-Slovenian MUSIC

The Jerry|Goetsch|Orchestra was organized in 1950, while all the members were still in high school. They started playing for high school dances and during the lunch break in the winter months in the school gym. Four of the original members are still with the band. The band specializes in brightening up old Bohemian (Czech) and German folk tunes with a bouncy dancing style. The band has developed a loyal following that travels with them to many of its appearances throughout Wisconsin and Minnesota.

During the 1950's the band had a weekly radio show in Wausau and for the past 25 years has had a TV show on WSAW, Channel 7, the longest continuous show in the station's history. Years ago the show was taped at the studio but now is taped with live audiences in ballrooms throughout Wisconsin. The band has over a dozen albums, 8-track tapes and cassettes. Some of the bands original 45's have now become collector items.

In 1972 the band started taking annual fall

tours to Europe and in the first year over 450 of their loyal fans went with them. Each year since, an average of about 175 fans join them on their annual trek throughout Europe. The biggest thrills for the band have been playing at the famous Hoffbrauhaus in Munich, Germany and at Musiky-Musiky in Prague, Czechoslovakia. In addition, the band has traveled to Japan, Hong Kong, Greece, and during the spring months alternates tours to Hawaii and on Caribbean cruises. The band has taken many bus tours as well to the World's Fair, Nashville, and to Canada and Hunter, NY for the German Alps Festival.

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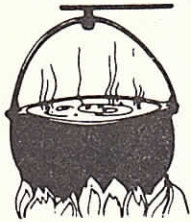

The Tenbusch Bros. Orchestra

Wally and Doug Tenbusch are second generation polka band leaders and musicians coming out of Michigan's Thumb area. Following in the footsteps of their father, Bob, they have put together a six piece group known as The Tenbusch Brothers. In addition to playing polish music, they also play a wide variety of dance music and have entertained audiences as near as Michigan, and far away as Ohio, New Jersey, and Connecticut.

The band has recently undergone some personnel changes and has gone back to their original "Honky Style" sound of polkas. Members of the present band include: Wally - accordion, keyboard and vocals; Doug - trumpet, concertina, bass and vocals; Doug Busch - bass and guitar; Ted Lubaczewski - drums; and Newcomer Bob Osentoski - 2nd accordion. Also returning part-time: Frank Majchrowski - clarinet, sax and fiddle.

The Tenbusch Brothers Orchestra will be appearing at the Summer Music Fest on Opening Day, Friday, August 12. Their style of music is sure to please the traveling polka people as well as the local patrons attending this year's fest. 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POLISH MUSIC

The Polka Family Band is a group of musicians formerly from Southern California and now living in Pennsylvania. Their music is in the contemporary category of polka which is finding much appeal among the young polka fans as well as those more traditionally inclined. Their stage performances are remembered by young and old as lively, energetic and professional. The band has performed on radio and television broadcasts, has six records to its credit, two of which have been submitted for Grammy consideration. They have appeared at the Disneyland Hotel, Queen Mary, Club Palamino in Hollywood, Atlantis Hotel in Atlantic City and have been invited to perform at many of the nation's largest polka festivals: Polka-bration, Action Park, Hunter Mountain, Seven Springs and this year for the first time, at the Summer Music Fest in Frankenmuth, MI.

Musically speaking, the band plays a modern style Polish-American polka. Because of the mixed heritage (Polish-Lithuanian-Mexican)

some listeners hear a Mexican flavor in the band. Instruments and players are: Frank Guzevich - accordion; Nellie Guzevich - tambourine, bells and maracas; Fred Guzevich - bass and fiddle; Hank Guzevich - trumpet; Greg Guzevich - drums and concertina; Alicia Guzevich - clarinet and sax; and John Milek - accordion and concertina. The similarity of the last names indicates that this is a family and indeed it is. Frank and Nellie are the parents and Fred through Alicia are the sons and daughter. John Milek is an "adopted" family member and adds musically and temperamentally to the band's character.

There is a packed house when the Polka Family Band plays, so don't miss your chance to see and hear these entertainers extraordinaire on Monday and Tuesday, August 15 and 16, at the Summer Music Fest. You'll be glad you did!

The Trel-Tones, from Pittsburgh, PA, have been playing together for more than thirty years. Members of the group include: Andy Fenus - bandleader, drums and vocals; brother Steve - sax, clarinet, trumpet and vocals; Emil Pohodich - bass guitar and accordion; Jody

Maddi - sax, clarinet, trumpet and vocals; and Rich Zabrowski - concertina, accordion and bass guitar.

Their special style of polkas, top 40 music, and country and western tunes, keeps them in demand for weddings, private parties, public dances and festivals. You can see this very talented band in Frankennuth, on Saturday and Sunday, August 13 and 14, at the Summer Music Fest.

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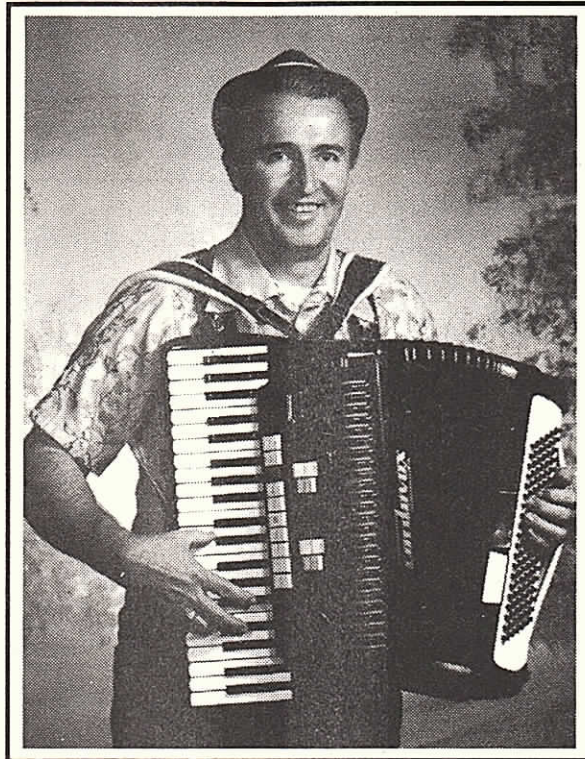

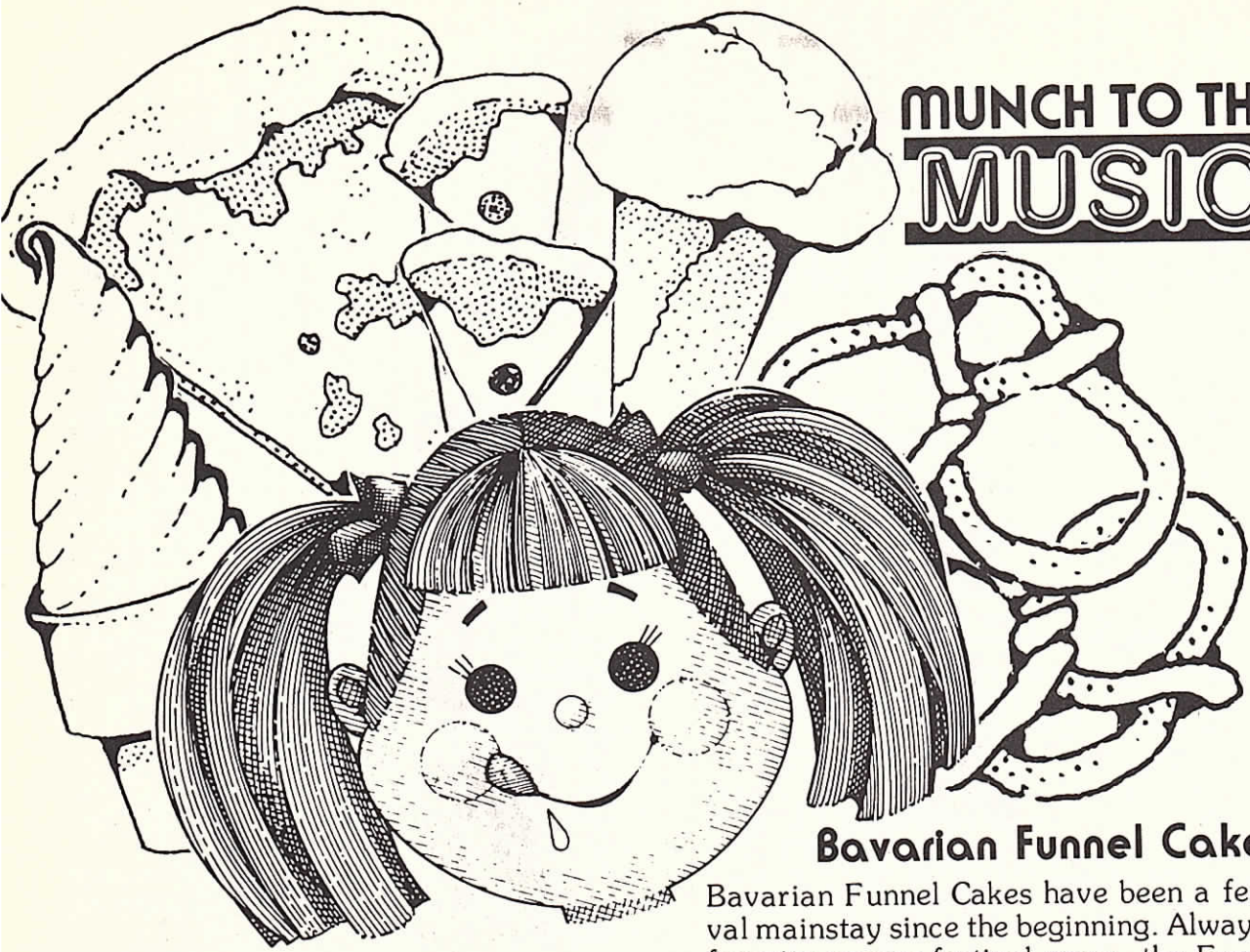

Bavarian Funnel Cakes

Bavarian Funnel Cakes have been a festival mainstay since the beginning. The rich batter is poured through a funnel into a pan of hot oil, fried on both sides and sprinkled with powdered sugar. It is about 9 inches in diameter and is served on a paper plate. Make the Summer Music Fest and a Bavarian Funnel Cake a tradition in your family.

Pizza

Pizza has always been a popular festival item among the young crowd and this year pizza will be made available at the Summer Music Fest. Indulge in pizza any day you want as just a snack or even a quick meal. Stop in at the pizza booth between dances and satisfy your taste buds with pizza.

Ice Cream

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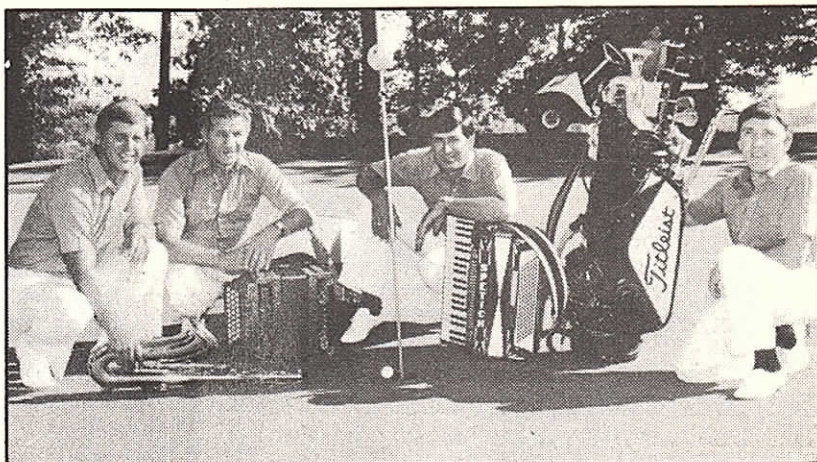
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SLOVENIAN MUSIC

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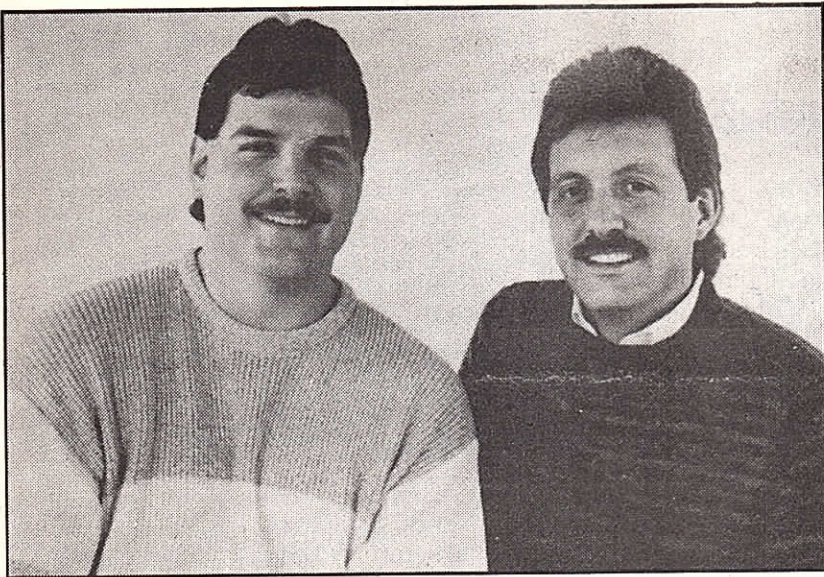
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TOP 40's D-J's **MUSIC**

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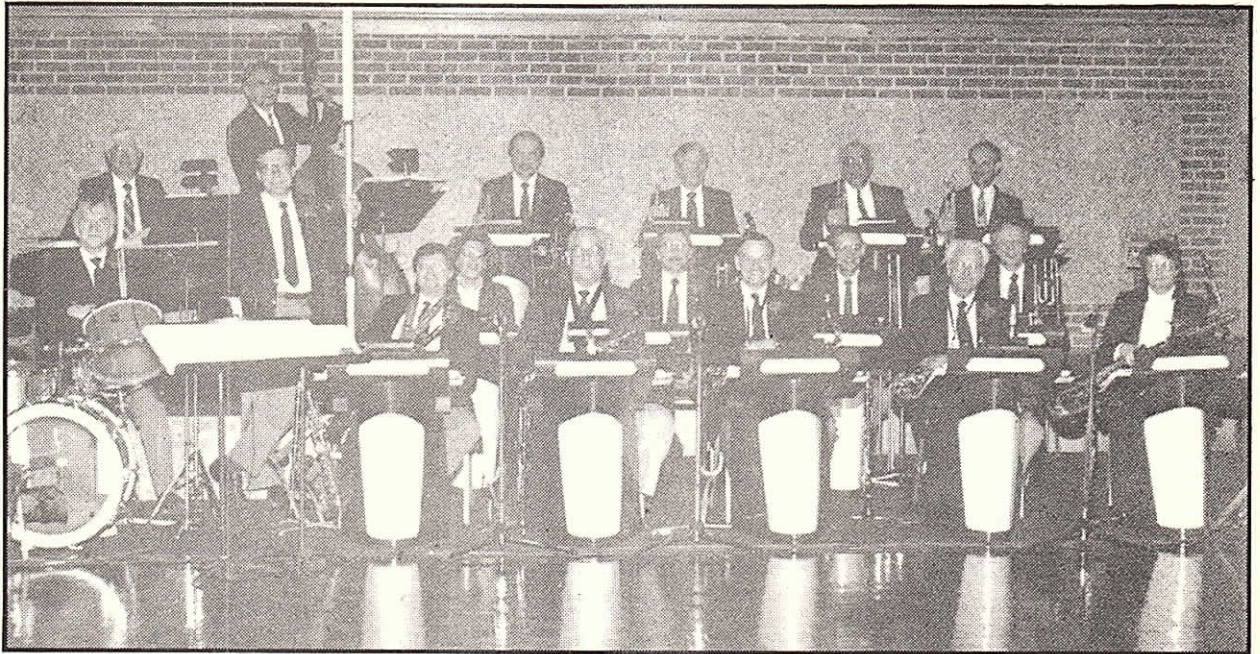
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BIG BAND MUSIC

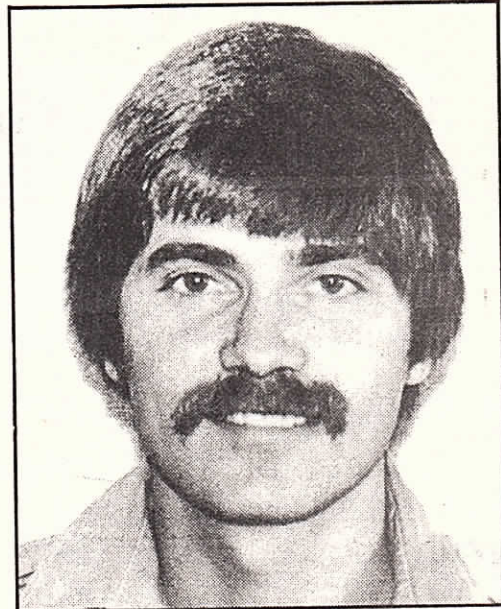

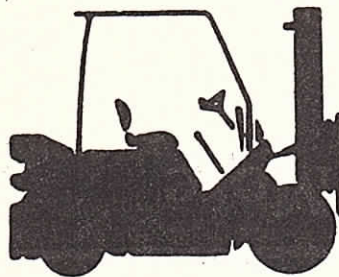
Lenny Longuski and the Style Stix

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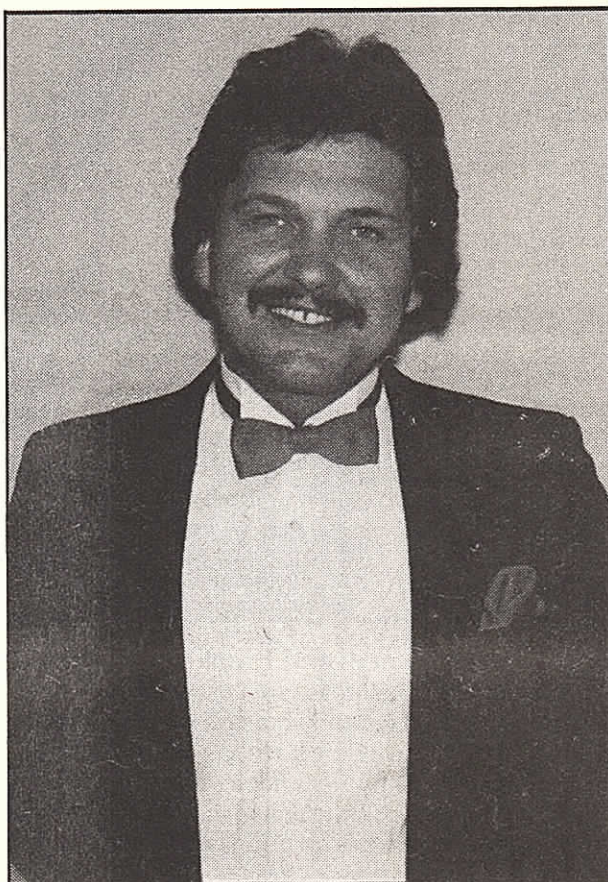

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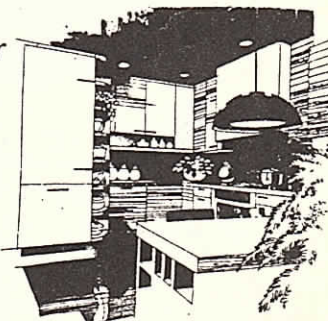
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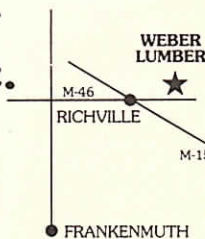
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Lenny Gomulka and Chicago Push

The Brass Express will be appearing at the Summer Music Fest eight of the ten days for your listening and dancing pleasure.

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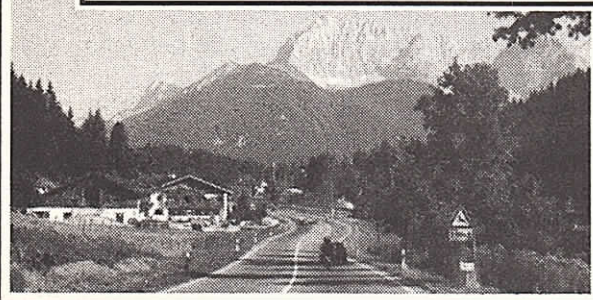

Walt formed his own recording company, Chalet Records, and has released 15 albums on this label. He also has seven albums on Stella Records out of New York.

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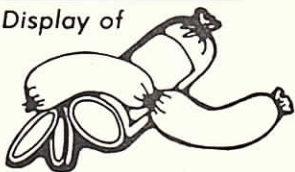
