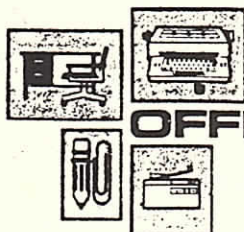
Marv Herzog and the Bavarian Polka Band, from Frankenmuth, Michigan, will be performing seven of the ten days of the Summer Music Fest. As co-host of the festival, Marv and his band will alternate with many other bands to complete the lineup of fine entertainment that is scheduled.

Marv has had his own band since he was 14 years old. Through the years, he has played most major German festivals and continues to be a leader in the world of polka music. He has performed in most states from coast to coast and Hawaii, plus Germany, Austria, Switzerland and Holland, promoting polka music everywhere he goes. He has been inducted into the Michigan Polka Hall of Fame and the International Polka Hall of Fame. He has recorded twenty-four albums, the last five released on his own label - Herzog Records.

Members of the band are: Marv - cor-dovox and vocals; his son Clint - lead guitar and vocals; Mark Wisniewski - accordion, guitar and vocals; and John Boynton - drums.

Marv has been a polka festival promoter for ten years and a radio DJ for over twenty-five years, currently on WKNX 1210 AM, six days per week. His expertise in festival planning has gained him added recognition in the polka world, helping to make the Summer Music Fest one of the top festivals in the country.

The Brass Express has been entertaining people at festivals and dances for 13 years. Like so many young polka bands attracting the younger crowd, they saw the need to expand their style and incorporated music from the '50s & '60s. They have three albums.

Members of their Brass Express are: Mark Janson - drums; Val Maurer - electric piano; Ron Oczepek - bass and vocals; Joel Zwerk - accordion and vocals; Al Stuart and Ron Ratkos - trumpets and vocals; and Rich Kowalski - saxophone and clarinet.

Mark is a Polka DJ on Saginaw's radio station WKCQ 98-FM, promoting polkas and polka functions. Since 1987, at various times during the year, Mark also sponsors polka dances, bringing in some of the same big name bands that also are booked for the Summer Music Fest.

As a musician, band-leader, DJ and promoter, Mark Janson is dedicated to the polka industry.

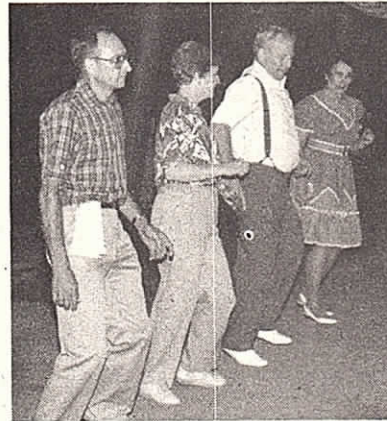

Polka Dance Contest Rules & Judging

CATEGORIES

TIMING - EXECUTION - VARIETY - SHOWMANSHIP
DANCE FORM - FLOOR CRAFT - DANCE WEAR

Each competitive category will have a dedicated Judge.
(150) points may be awarded as follows:

TIMING 30 POINTS
Does the dance team consistently dance to the rhythm and beat of the music; do they stay in time during the execution of their dance routines as they flow from one routine to another?

EXECUTION 30 POINTS
Does the dance team have good dance mechanics; are they in sync with their body movements, kicks, hand movements; is their transition from routine to routine "choppy or smooth"?

VARIETY 25 POINTS
Does the dance team display multiple dance routines, or do they repeat the same few over and over? The level of the dance routine complexity will be taken into consideration, as well as originality and creativity.

SHOWMANSHIP 20 POINTS
This category will measure the dance presentation and styling. Dance Teams will be rated on their entrance, performance, and exit from the competition floor. Are they exciting to watch? Are they entertaining?

DANCE FORM 20 POINTS
The dance posture of both dancers are evaluated. Do they stand tall; are their shoulders slumping; do they look at their feet; are they smiling?

FLOOR CRAFT 20 POINTS
How well does the dance team use the dance floor; do they dance in one area, or do they use the entire floor; do they bump into other couples, or cause other couples to collide; do they have good movement, control, and leadership throughout the dance?

DANCE WEAR 5 POINTS
Dance Teams are encouraged to look their best in competition.

0 Points - Shorts, sneakers, tank tops, etc.
1 Point - Nice appearance, no special dance wear.
2-3 Points - Coordinated colors w/pants, shirts, skirts, blouses.
4-5 Points - Matching dance costumes that sparkle, etc.

In case of a TIE in Total Points scored, the tie will be broken by the most points scored by category rank. The first tie breaker will be: TIMING, then EXECUTION, then VARIETY, etc., through DANCE WEAR.

In fairness to all competitors and dance styles, the contest will be judged by qualified polka personalities from various states.

- All DANCE TEAMS must be officially registered for the contest before 3:00 PM the day of the contest, or sooner. Advance registration is recommended. The competition will be limited to (24) Dance Teams. A Dance Team is defined as (1) male and (1) female dancer.
- The dance competition will be divided into (4) four Divisions:
 - o Junior Division ... Age 7-16 BOTH DANCERS
 - o Master Division ... Age 35-50 PLUS RULE (*)
 - o Senior Division ... Age 51 or over PLUS RULE (*)
 - o Open Division ... Age Restrictions ... SEE RULE (#)

(*) Female age determines the Division eligible. Male age must not be less than (5) years of the female Division.
(#) Dance Team ages must be within (10) years of each other. One dancer (male or female) must be age (17) or older.
- Each Division must have at least (3) Dance Teams in competition. If this criteria is not met, the Division may be canceled. The effected Dance Teams may elect to compete in another Division.
- The competition is intended for amateurs. Dancers are considered amateurs if they dance for fun and enjoyment; who:
 - Receive cash, trophies, or gratuities from competitions, or
 - Teach or assist with dance instruction to members of non-profit organizations and receive a small compensation in appreciation for their assistance; or
 - Are members of performing dance groups, and do not receive individual compensation for their performance.

Professional dancers are not eligible to compete. Professional is defined as any individual who receives a substantial income from providing dance instruction and/or dance exhibitions. The contest organizer reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- Dance Teams will dance in competition for approximately (3) minutes.
 - Routines that use more than a (5) second loss of hand contact, and/or routines done in dance rhythms other than polka tempo are not recommended for any Division.
 - Routines, such as lifts, drops, leg splits, etc., may only be performed in the Open Division.
- Dance Teams agree to accept the Judging results as final! Each team may obtain a copy of their scores upon request.
 - Division trophies will be awarded for: 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. Married couples of winning Dance Teams will receive (1) trophy. Individual trophies will be awarded to the other winners.
 - Certificates of participation will be awarded to all dancers.
- Dance Teams enter the competition at their own risk, and do not hold POLKA'S UNLIMITED, INC., or the festival coordinator responsible for injury or personal loss of any kind.
- All Dance Teams grant permission to video tape or photograph the competition by POLKA'S UNLIMITED, INC., and by anyone in attendance of the dance competition.

Frankentrost Band

Frankentrost was a settlement north of Frankenmuth, on M-46, established in the mid 1800's. The largest structure still remaining is Immanuel Lutheran Church. The Frankentrost Band first organized in 1895 with fourteen members and continued until 1927.

It then reorganized in 1940, but disbanded during World War II. In 1955 the band organized once again under the leadership of Norman Kosche and

has been active ever since, now having a membership of forty men under the direction of Tom Reinbold. They are reminiscent of a typical brass band in Germany performing for the Munich Oktoberfest, so their style depicts their strong German heritage.

The Frankentrost Band's appearance at the Summer Music Fest is Sunday, August 19.
