



# Friday, August 9th MARV HERZOG DAY



Question: Is there anything that beats a great party? Answer: Two great parties! That's just how organizers of Music Fest 2002 will kick off this year's event. August 9th is day one of the Party of the Year and also the dual celebration of Marv Herzog's 70th birthday. Let the fun (twice as much fun) begin!

Nearly 60 years ago. Mary strapped on his first accordion – he hasn't put it down since. From those early beginnings, the old German songs his father so loved, the country music from the Grand Ole Opry and the polkas and waltzes of Flint radio station WFDF, thus evolved the music that is uniquely **Mary Herzog**.

The Michigan and International Hall of Fames have welcomed Marv into their prestigious company. His band and his music are welcomed everywhere. Crossing the Mississippi or the Atlantic, Marv's ability to bring people together in fellowship, friendship and fun prompted this response from the City of Frankenmuth:

Over a year ago, Marv was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. Cards and letters, prayers and well-wishes all conveyed the underlying message "to keep the faith, Marv." As Marv will tell you, his faith is not in question, and your cards and prayers are a God-send. A Polka Mass on Sunday, August 11th, led by Bishop Kenneth Untener, with music by Marv Herzog, is an affirmation of that faith.

Aaron Slivinski, son of Dave Slivinski and Lisa Herzog Slivinski, and grandson of Marv Herzog, was introduced to Polka Music at a very young age. While just learning how to talk, Aaron's grandpa, Frank Slivinski, taught him a polish song. By the time he was 2 years old, Aaron was singing that song in his Grandpa Herzog's polka band. As his repertoire grew, so did his talent. He began to play a small accordion with the band in addition to singing. He received his first set of drums for his third Christmas. Soon

after, his talent for playing drums became evident.

When Aaron was six years old, his first opportunity to play the drums with Marv Herzog's band came at the Summer Music Fest in Frankenmuth, Michigan. He played the "Dance Hall Polka" to thunderous applause. During the following year, he continued to practice on the drums, completed a year of piano lessons, and is currently taking drum lessons.

During the summer of 2000, seven-year-old Aaron continued to perform with his grandpa's band, singing and playing drums. In September of that year, he had his first opportunity to play drums with Toledo Polkamotion and realized it was exciting to play Polish-style polka music, too.

The following year brought more opportunities for Aaron. He had demonstrated such ability on the drums that some of the best polka bands in the country began asking him to perform with them. Throughout the summer of 2001, Aaron performed with bands such as Jimmy Sturr, Polka Family, Lenny Gomulka, Eddie Blazonczyk, The Dynatones, Dick Pillar, The Goodtime Dutchmen, Marshall Lackowski, and many others.

Although Aaron is devoted to the drums, he continues to sing in his grandpa's band and now sings duets with his younger sister, Rachel. They delight audiences around the country by singing songs in German, Polish and English.

Aaron, Rachel and their Dad have a local variety band featuring Aaron on the drums and both of the children on vocals. In addition to polka music, Aaron has had the opportunity to perform with local country bands as well as playing drums in his church choir. Aaron turned 10 years old on June 16, 2002.

# Frankenmuth SCHUHPLATTLER

25 years ago, Michael learned to dance and perform while living in Munich, Germany. At a young age, he was hired to perform with professional entertainers on the weekends. With more and more performances, along with his expanding knowledge (cowbells, spoons, acting, announcing), he rapidly became known around



the Munich Scene. Soon after a TV talent show, he and his former partner (Jürgen, also his teacher and trainer) were hired by the famous "Platzl" Theater. It was then that the world renowned Munich Hofbräuhaus discovered him, offering a full time contract to establish a 6-piece show group. This was the start of his professional career. Along with the Hofbräuhaus performances came a second full-time contract at the Hackerkeller and Platzl. The group was then expanded to its final size of 16 dancers (girls and guys). Later, the Platzl hired Michael as their musical director for Bavarian entertainment. Michael's performances at the Hofbräuhaus lasted seven years until he left for the USA. He gave his contract to a former dancer, and Michael's show can still be seen in Munich today. Michael knew Frankenmuth from several prior engagements when he was hired by the Frankenmuth Bavarian Inn and Chamber of Commerce to perform during the annual Bavarian festivals and the grand opening of the Motor Lodge. He decided to make Frankenmuth his home in November, 1995. Soon afterwards, he and Mark established the group, and after only 2 months the Frankenmuth Schuhplattler were on stage for their very first performance at the cold, but fun, "Zehnder Snowfest". The Schuhplattler soon became a name, found sponsors (Gary McClellan, Chamber of Commerce) and got ready for more and more festivals and private parties. Yodeling and singing were added, and later a 3-piece band was formed.

The Frankenmuth Schuhplattler have performed at numerous festivals all over Michigan, Missouri, Ohio, and Indiana, along with many private parties. Our greatest honor was being invited by Governor Engler, to represent Michigan at the "Promote Michigan Tourism" festival in Chicago for 2 consecutive years and being invited to perform at his January 1999 Inauguration in Detroit. We are proud to be Schuhplattler, and proud to keep the German/Bavarian traditions alive, making them unforgettable and passing them on to our next generation. That's what the Schuhplattler are today.







Octave is a twelve-member jazz ensemble of young men and women ranging in age from 12 to 18 years old. Our band has grown and now includes three lovely vocalists, as well as four of the original band members who can and will add vocal support. We are independent from any school group and are privately funded by our parents and out of our own pockets. Our band

was formed in 1999 as an experiment at the Frankenmuth Middle School by then Assistant Band Director, Matt Corrigan. Mr. Corrigan was offered a full-time job in another school district and the school did not have the resources or personnel to continue with the jazz band.

We enjoyed playing together and were not ready for the band to break up, so our parents helped us find a director to continue in Mr. Corrigan's place. Steve Rodriguez is an exceptional Music Major at SVSU, as well as an outstanding musician. Since taking over director duties, he has more than tripled our repertoire. 
