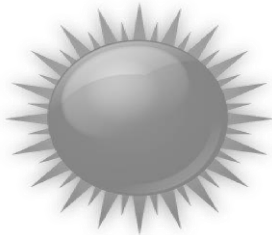


Slippery Rock Park Civic Association Newsletter

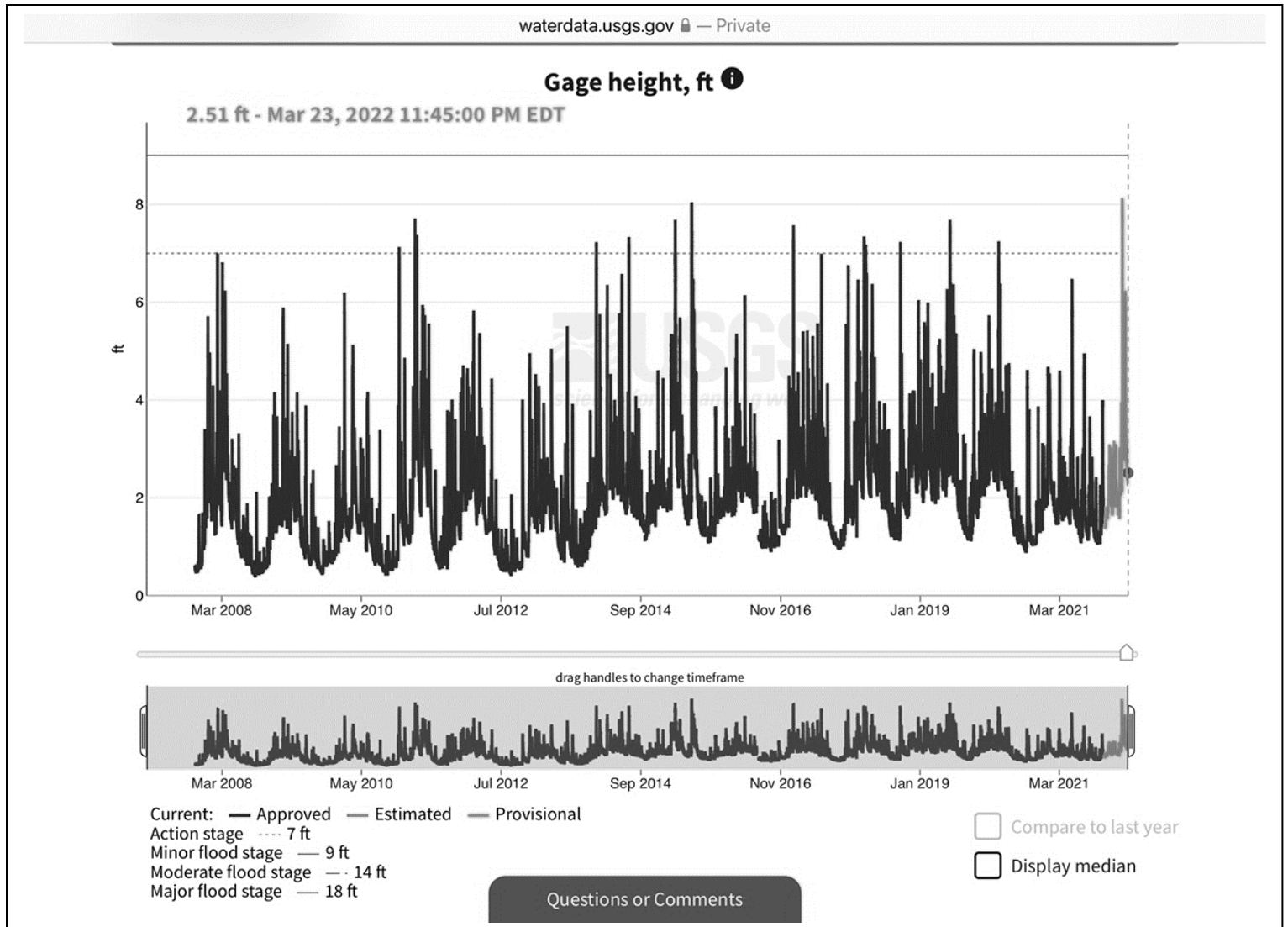

Remember to maintain your In Lot septic system. Prevention is less expensive than repair or replacement.

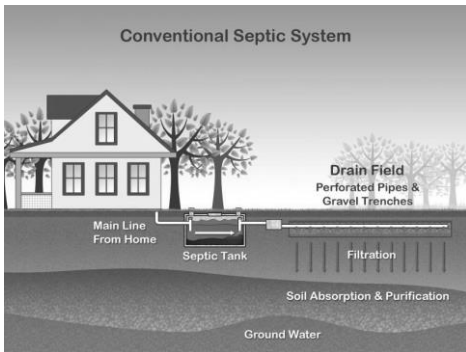
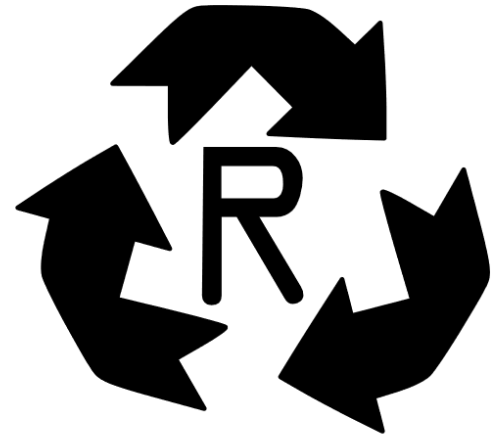
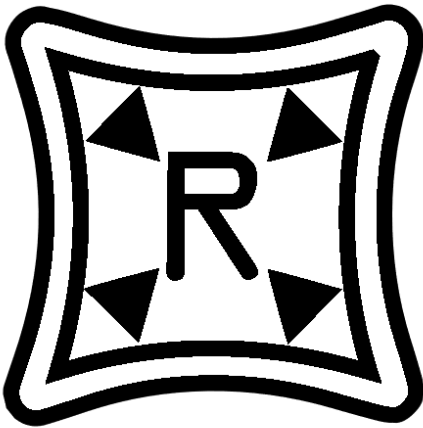
