Not just for pleasure, enjoyment and health, Not just for honours and prestige and wealth...


But pray for a purpose to make life worth living, And pray for the joy of unselfish giving

COPING MECHANISMS

"The whole Israelite community set out from Elim and came to the Desert of Sin, which is between Elim and Sinai, on the fifteenth day of the second month after they had come out of Egypt. In the desert the whole community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The Israelites said to them, 'If only we had died by the LORD's hand in Egypt! There we sat around pots of meat and ate all the food we wanted, but you have brought us out into this desert to starve this entire assembly to death.'" (Ex. 16:1-3)

When times are fearful and full of despair, we often seek comfort in "coping mechanisms". Some coping mechanisms are beneficial - like prayer, fasting, scripture reading and meditation (discipleship tools). Some are not - like over-eating, excessive drinking or "checking out" with various forms of entertainment. Sometimes we even cope by trying to keep so busy that we simply don't have time to think about our problems. These worldly coping mechanisms are easy to fall into and require very little effort. We simply surrender or "give into" them. These carnal vices give us a sense of relief and comfort. They certainly make us feel better. The problem is, they not only are completely inadequate in meeting our actual temporary needs, they end up making our mental and spiritual condition worse. Only God is able to give us true peace, strength and comfort. And only in God can we find refuge and protection.

One common coping mechanism is that of nostalgia. Nostalgia is romanticizing the past. It is idealizing a former time when things were not near as fearful as they appear to be now. As a coping mechanism, nostalgia can give us a peaceful and elated feeling of a simpler life without fear. Nostalgia makes us feel safe and secure. This spirit or enchantment of

nostalgia is what the Israelites turned to when faced with their very real fear of starvation and death. In romanticizing the past, the Israelites longed for a time when everything was so much better. It was an illusion of course. In reality they were slaves in Egypt. The Egyptians treated them horribly, even killing their babies. But when faced with the possibility of death, they chose this euphoric spirit of nostalgia. rather than turning to The LORD and trusting in Him. They chose nostalgia over faith, even though they had personally seen all the powerful miracles The LORD had performed on their behalf in Egypt.

The spirit of nostalgia is very seductive. I frequently hear people express (usually out of frustration and exhaustion) that they just want things to get back to normal. It is understandable to allow our minds go there. But nostalgia will not give us what we seek. It never has. Only God is able to see us through our fears and insecurities. Only God is powerful enough, faithful enough and present enough to meet our every need. The blood of Jesus, and only His blood, is able to deliver us from every evil. Only He is the same yesterday, today and forever. Only His Word endures forever. Heaven and earth WILL pass away. But His truth will not. This hope is what Jesus spoke of when teaching about the man who built his house on the rock and not the sand. The waves came, the winds blew, and the storm pummeled the house. But the house withstood the storm because it was built on a rock (the words of Jesus). This is the power and result of being a true disciple and following a mighty and powerful God. Don't look anywhere else for comfort. You won't find it Look to Jesus and Jesus alone. Only then will you find an enduring strength, peace and hope that overcomes the world. "In this world you will have tribulation. But take heart, I have overcome the world." (John 16:33)
