The Meaning of Worship

"Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshippers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshippers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshippers must worship in the Spirit and in truth." (John 4:23-24)

Worship can mean different things for different people. For many, it has to do with style, form and music genre. But a deeper look at scripture reveals something more profound regarding worship. The first time the word "worship" is used in the bible is when Abraham is instructed to take his son, Isaac, and go to a particular mountain where he is to sacrifice Isaac to the Lord. (Human sacrifice was common then, although the Lord forbade it). Upon arriving at the location, Abraham tells his servants to stay where they are as he and the boy are going to worship at further location. The Hebrew word for worship in this story is "shachah", which literally means to fall face down or lay prostrate before. The New Testament Greek word for worship is "proskuneo" and has the same meaning However, it's the motivation behind this behavior that Jesus refers to when saying that God desires to be worshipped in Spirit and in truth. That motivation has everything to do with what we believe to be true about God.

The phrase "Pistis Christou" appears 24 times in the New Testament and is commonly translated as "Faith IN Christ". However, a more accurate translation of the Greek would read, "The faith OF Christ". In other words, it is not only essential to have faith or believe in what Christ has done and Who He is, it is just as essential to have trust in what Jesus himself believed about God. Jesus' unwavering core belief was that God is not only all powerful and all knowing, but that He is infinitely good. It was Jesus' belief in God's goodness that led Him to do and say everything He did. It was Jesus' belief in God's goodness that gave Him the confidence to surrender everything he had, even his own life, into God's sovereign care knowing that He would lose nothing. It was God's goodness that gave Jesus' life meaning, purpose and sense of inseparable belonging. This innate belief in God's goodness was why Jesus' life was a perpetual expression of worship. And it is this state of perpetual worship that He offers to all who follow Him.

As Jesus was dying on the cross he publically recited Psalm 22. The Psalm begins with the phrase, "My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" This statement expresses the despairing, sad and painful reality of those who truly believe in God, but who also know the cruel suffering and evil of this world. And yet, toward the end of this Psalm it states, "I will declare your name to my people: in the assembly I will praise you." This final expression of praise demonstrates the power of Jesus' faith in God's goodness. Despite the physical pain of being tortured; despite the emotional pain of being abandoned and ridiculed by His own friends and people; despite being executed unjustly by a corrupt government; Jesus still worshipped God in joy and in Spirit! He still trusted that God's goodness was *far* greater than the evil surrounding Him. There, upon the cross, in all its shame, pain and injustice Jesus worshipped the Living God. This is the kind of worship (His worship) that uplifts, empowers and restores God's people even today.

As human beings, we were all created to usher in all of God's creation into praise, adoration and worship of the one true living God. In fact, only when we are in this state of worship (with our whole heart, soul, mind and strength) do we experience what it means to be fully human. On our own this is impossible. The sheer weight of sin with all its pain, suffering, despair and shame robs us of our ability to see God's goodness or worship Him because of it. But through the cross we have become more than

conquerors of sin and all its hopelessness. Through Jesus' sacrifice we are being made new and alive. We are being given a new hope and a new reality with which we are able to worship God in all of His goodness even in the midst of suffering. Through Christ we are being inwardly transformed to worship God with our whole hearts. May this spirit of worship fill you lives with His praise, glory and adoration, as we seek Him together!
