
Advent and Christmas Season

The Church Year begins on Dec. 1st with the season of **Advent** (the 40 days before Christmas). It is a time to prepare for Christ's coming.

The blue parament (sometimes purple) on the altar is a royal color and signifies hope. Advent Wreath (circle) represents the oneness of God - He is without beginning and without end. One white candle in the center of the wreath represents Christ and is surrounded by blue (or purple) candles. The evergreen/holly branches represents life, the leaves stand for the crown of thorns of Christ.

The tradition of the **Christmas Tree** began in early European societies that believed that trees that remained green in winter had strong powers. Soldiers and immigrants from Germany brought the first Christmas trees to the U.S. during the Revolutionary War.

Our church tree will be decorated with Chrismons ("Christ's monograms") which are symbols of Christ and are found in scripture. The tree reminds us of Christ, the Tree of Life, offering gifts of light, life, and wisdom. The altar paraments will change to white on Christmas which suggests the innocence, purity
