

Scrappy Mini Quilt Pattern

Finished size, 30 inches Square



Fabric lines pictured

Balboa and Seashore Drive by Sherri & Chelsi of Moda Fabrics

Kona Snow jelly roll for sashing strips

Scrappy Mini Quilt / Wall Hanging / Pillow / Table Topper

Finished size 30 inches square

This easy to sew quilt is perfect for using up scraps!

The biggest square is 6 ½ inches
Longest Rectangle 2 ½ x 12 ½ inches

This mini quilt is a fun, easy, beginner level project.

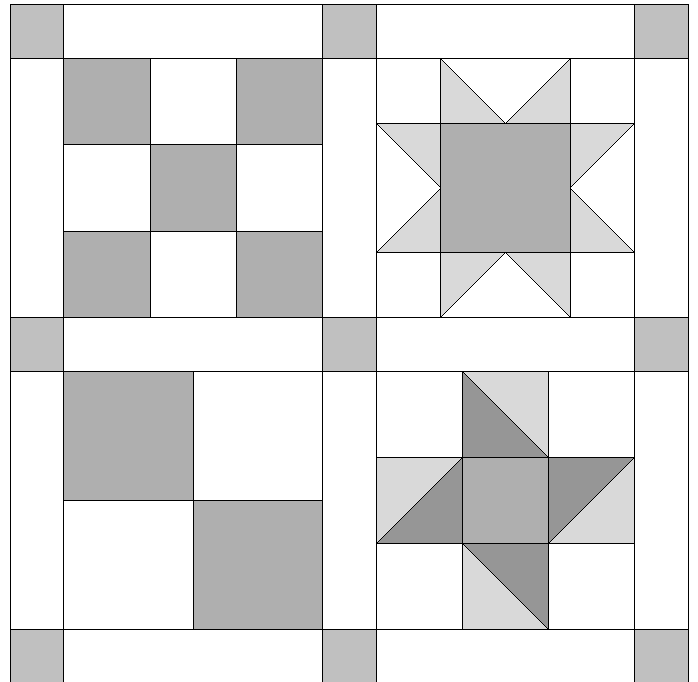
Each block finishes to 12 inches. Feel free to change out and swap the blocks, customize your layout, and use only the blocks you like. Use more or less blocks to make the project bigger or smaller.

Fabric Requirements and Block layout

All seams are sewn with 1/4 inch seam allowance – Detailed pictures provided after the block fabric cutting guides.

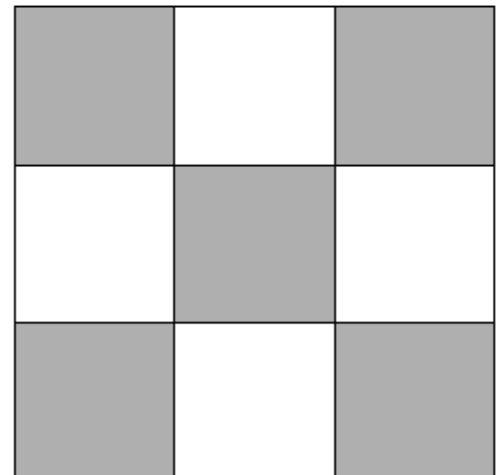
Nine Patch

Choose two fabrics

Cut five, 4 ½ inch squares from one fabric

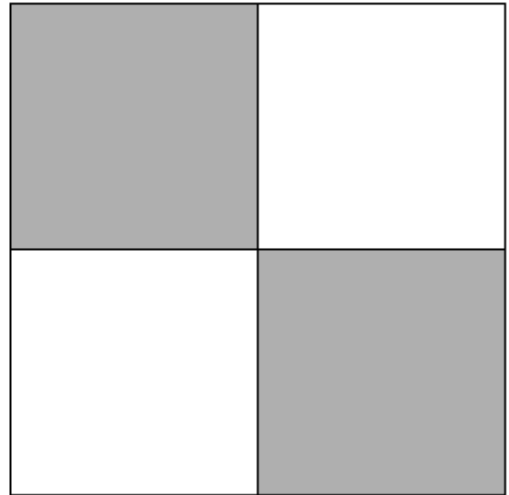
Cut four, 4 ½ inch squares from the other fabric

Arrange as shown and sew your block



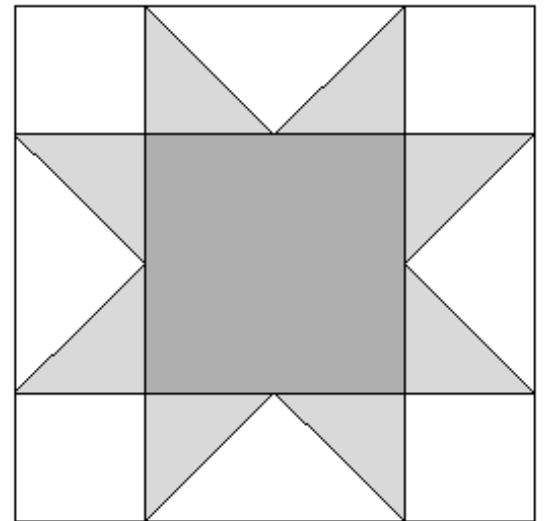
Four Patch

Choose two fabrics
Cut two, 6 ½ inch squares from one fabric
Cut two, 6 ½ inch squares from the other fabric
Arrange as shown and sew your block



Variable Star Block

Choose four fabrics
Cut one, 6 ½ inch square for the center
Cut four, 3 ½ inch squares for the four corners
Flying Geese:
Cut four 6 ½ by 3 ½ inch rectangles for the background (shown in white)
Cut eight 3 ½ inch squares for the triangles (shown in light gray)
See assembly pictures
Arrange as shown and sew your block



Friendship Star Block

Choose four fabrics

Cut one, 4-inch square for the center square

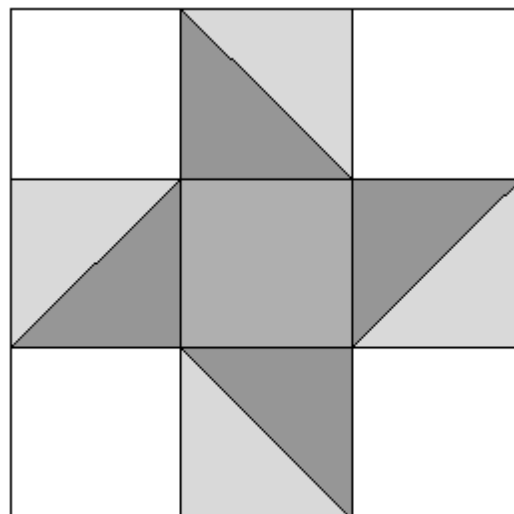
Cut four, 4 ½ inch squares for the four corners (shown in white)

Half Square Triangles

Cut four 5-inch squares in one color (light gray) and four 5-inch squares in a second color (dark gray) to make your half square triangles.

Arrange as shown and sew your block



Cornerstones and Sashing, Backing, Binding

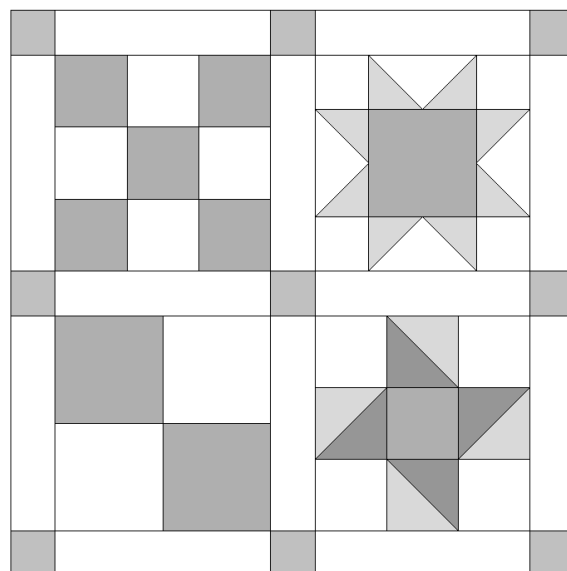
Cornerstones, Cut nine, 2 ½ inch squares

Sashing, Cut twelve, 2 ½ by 12 ½ inch rectangles

See Assembly pictures for quilt construction

Backing, 38 inches square to allow room for quilting (hooping or longarm)

Binding, 130 inches of 2 ½ inch strips, sewn together and pressed in half



Assembly Pictures – Block and Quilt top assembly

Nine Patch

1. Choose and layout fabric.



2. Sew rows.



3. Press to dark fabric so seams nest.



4. Sew rows together.



5. Back of block showing nested seams.



Four Patch

1. Choose and layout fabric.



2. Sew rows.



3. Press to dark fabric so seams nest.



4. Sew rows together.



5. Back of block showing nested seams.



Variable Star Block

Making the Flying Geese, make four

1. One, 3 ½ x 6 ½ inch rectangle and two, 3 ½ inch squares.



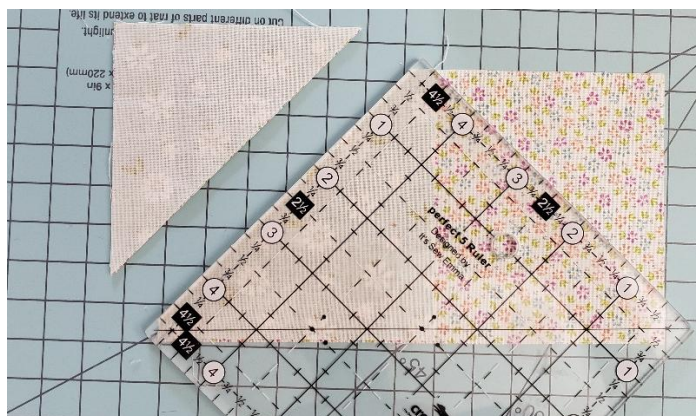
2. On the wrong side of the squares draw a line down the middle. I used a Frixion fineliner pen.



3. Line up one square with the rectangle right sides together, pin on either side as shown, sew on the line.



4. Cut 1/4 inch away from the sewn line, this Creative Grids ruler has a 1/4-inch guide. You can lay that on the sewn line corner to corner, then cut 1/4 inch away from the sewn line.



5. Press out the corner you just sewed (I pressed to the blue), then repeat with the next corner as shown.



You can save your corner cut off scrap triangles, sew with 1/4-inch seam allowance, and square to 2 ½ inches. You'll have eight half square triangles at the end to save for another project. 😊



6. Make four flying geese units.



7. Layout your block.



8. Sew your rows together. Press your seams. I press so the seams nest, you can also press open.



9. Sew your rows together.

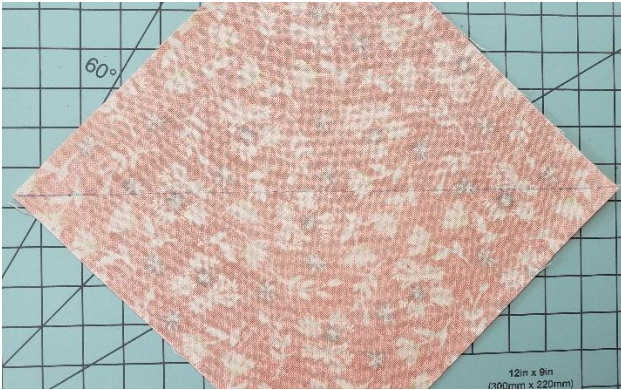


Friendship Star

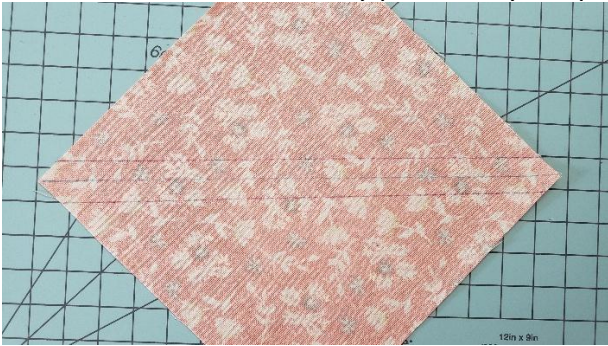
1. Make four, half square triangles. Grab two, five-inch squares in different colors.



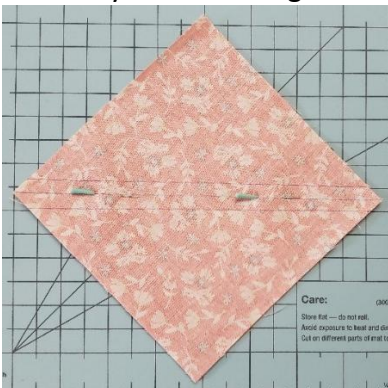
2. Pick one fabric and draw a line corner to corner. I used a Frixion Fineliner.



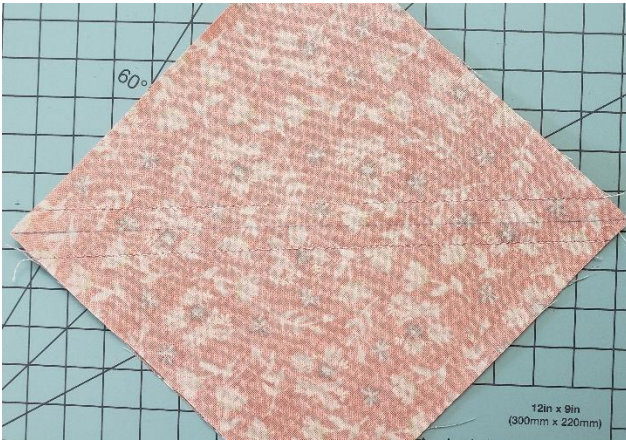
3. Draw another line on either side of the first line (drawn in blue) 1/4 inch on either side (purple) You'll have three lines. In my photo they are purple, blue in the center, and purple.



4. Place your fabrics right side together and pin along the center line.



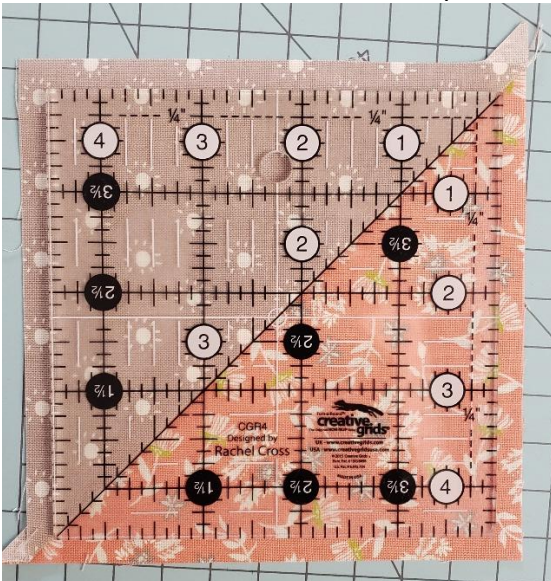
5. Sew on the purple lines (the two outside lines), then cut along the center line (blue line).



6. Press to one side, I pressed towards the darker fabric (brown).



7. Trim each block to 4 ½ inches square. Make Four blocks.



8. Layout your block.



9. Sew the rows.



10. Sew the rows together.



Cornerstones, sashing, and top assembly

Layout your quilt as desired. I originally had the star blocks in opposite corners. However, when I went to assemble the quilt I realized this layout would have all the pink/peach on side, and all the blue on the other, so I swaped the blocks to balance the colors.



Sew the cornerstones and sashing as desired. I sewed in rows, top to bottom and pressed to nest the seams.



Sew the rows together – your top is done!
