ost pandemic, I am retired, feral, Episcopal clergy. I still occasionally travel for short-term deployment. I have been a priest in clinical practice for 35 years—predominately in psychiatric services. I have worked in office, hospital, and parish settings—and occasionally on inland waterways [Tennessee Valley] for Seaman's Church Institute. I am looking at my fourth generation of bishops and their retinues, and my third generation of psychiatrists.

In the 20 teens, I ran consultations with churches on the east coast. In the 20 aughts, I was department head of a large state psychiatric hospital where I served on the governing body and chaired the ethics committee. Before that, I maintained a successful private practice and consultancy for most of a decade. Before that, I have been everything from parish priest to police officer; mechanic to missionary; print reporter to repo man; chaplain to the saintly and the insane.

As a pensioner, I am happy to be supply clergy, when available. I'll preach a fine sermon, celebrate Eucharist, take your money, and disappear. As Dashiell Hammett observed about a similar profession, I am not only paid for my services, I am paid to leave. If you think you would like to engage me further, we need to have a serious, realistic chat.

I consult for religious issues in psychiatry. I am a pathologist. I work with trauma, religious psychopathology, personality disorder, religious abuse, self-injury, and misconduct. If you are an ecclesial authority whose churches don't have such problems: I have little unique to offer. Please do not call me for standard-issue interim positions. I have no time travel machine to return a congregation to the 1990s. I am weary of pleading with leaders for cultural change. I have neither interest nor aptitude in being a chaplain to the country club, maintaining a religiously themed civic association or lodge hall, or helping bishops hide the bodies.

I prefer my work with under-served and working poor communities. I will collaborate with congregations doing poverty-informed, culturally competent, respectful ministry in that space. Not paternalism, not charity, not *noblesse oblige*.

I am a poor peoples' pastor and occasional chaplain to creative communities in the Mid-South and Southern Appalachia. Theologically, I skew toward social justice themes of Hebrew prophecy and The Sermon on the Mount. I would not be considered evangelical or Christian nationalist. I have past or present alliances with the Religious Coalition for Reproductive Choice, Integrity USA, and organized labor.
